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Madrid, Jan. 22.

THe Count de Vauguyon, Ambassador Extraordinary from the Crown of France, is arrived here, and is preparing for his publick Entry. The King has sent the Sieur Carillo with a Commission to Command his Forces in Biscay, upon some Advices his Majesty had received, that the French were drawing their Forces together on those Frontiers, and that it was suspected they designed to attempt something by way of satisfaction, for the Murth of the Fishermen of Andaye, which they pretend was committed by the Inhabitants of Fontarabia.

Vienna, Feb. 1. The ill weather has for some days hindered the departure of Count Caprara, the Emperors Ambassador to the Grand Signior, who it's now said, will begin his Journey the beginning of the next week without fail. The Conferences that were appointed to be held at Tyrnaw, are removed to Cassovia, wherethe Palatine of Hungary, and several of the greatest Men of that Kingdom, are now repairing to Treat with Count Teckelej, the Chief of the Hungarian Malecontents, who for that purpose will come thither in person. The Duke of Lorraine will stay some time here, and we are assured that if the Emperor have an Army in the Field this next Summer, his Highness will Command it. Monsieur Schurz is come hither, and it is said that the Emperor will give him the Command of all his Dragoons, which are to be reinforced with 3000 Men in three Regiments: we are told that there will be likewise raised nine new Regiments of Foot, and three of Croats, besides four of Horse.

Francfort, Feb. 8. The States of the Circle of Bavaria Asssembled at Wasserburg, have resolved to furnish their Quota of the Army of the Empire in two Months, reckoning from the 22 of January, and even sooner, if the necessity of Affairs shall so require; and have withal Declared, that if it shall be thought necessary to add 20000 Men more to the said Army, that they will with great readiness contribute their part thereof. The like Resolutions we doubt not will be taken by the other Circles; and that they will be diligently and effectually executed, in order to the bringing the said Army into the Field, to act as there may be occasion for the defence and security of the Empire. In the meantime little is to be expected from the Conferences appointed to be held here; and since the Declaration which the French Ambassadors made, of the King their Masters pretension, to have all the Lands and Places he has possessed himself of since the Peace of Nimeguen, yielded to him, the hopes many had of this Meeting are quite vanished.

Cologne, Feb. 20. Our Elector is going to raise 1400 Men, and Colonel d'Avila has a Commission to raise a Regiment for the Service of the Empe-

Brussels, Feb. 17. Yesterday arrived here an Extraordinary Courier from Spain, who, among others, brought Orders for the Count d'Arbinto's continuing here in the station he now is in. An Express is likewise arrived from Luxemburg, with an account that that place is every day more and more streightened, and that the French are going to make a Citadel of the Capucins Cloyster at Arlon. Colonel Obern is arrived at Ostend with the Recruits for the Irish Regiment; and two other Ships are daily expected with the rest. Colonel Porter's Regiment is Mustered and Clothed, and has Orders to march to Malines. The Seneschal of Liege, who was apprehended near Newport, is brought Prisoner to the Caille of Gant. The Letters from Liege inform us, that the French have hitherto forbore to execute the Decree of the Sovereign Chamber of Metz, adjudging the Countrey of Stavelo as a Dependence to the Crown of France; and that their Troops which were marching thither to take possession of the same, have been countermanded, upon the applications that have been made to his most Christian Majesty by the Bishop of Strasburg.

Brussels, Feb. 20. The Prince of Parma having received Orders from Spain to relieve the City of Luxemburg, has thereupon held a Great Council of War, to consult with the General Officers about the putting them in execution; they have all according to his Highnesses desire, delivered their opinions in Writing. And at the same time we are informed, that his Highness is sending General Agurio for Holland (and that he will part hence tomorrow Morning) to Demand of the States-General the assistance stipulated by the Treaty between the Crown of Spain and them. Last night Monsieur del Val arrived here from Paris, and had this day a long Audience of his Highness; and we are told, that he will return for France the next week. Count Valsayn, who arrived here some time since from Luxemburg, is dispatched back with Moneys for that Garrison. Monsieur Heugh, late Ambassador from the King of Denmark at the French Court, arrived here last Tuesday, and parted again yesterday Morning.

Brussels, Feb. 24. We have Advice from Luxemburg, that the Gunners and Ingeniers, whom his Highness sent thither about ten days since, are safely entered the Place, notwithstanding all the precautions the French had used to hinder it; and we hope that by this time Count Vallasne, who carried with him 10000 Crowns, is likewise arrived here. Last night we received an Account by an Express, that the French have seized upon the Castle of Aremborg, in the Countrey of Eyselt, belonging to the Duke d'Archebois, Monsieur Christini is returned from Courtray, with an Answer of the French Commissioners to his last Paper, concerning their pretensions upon Alost, &c.
