At the General Session of the Peace of our Lord the King, holden for the City of London, at the Guildhall, within the said City, on Monday the 28th of November, in the Fifty-fifth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King, Defender of the Faith, before Samuel Birch, Esq. Mayor of the City of London, Sir James Shaw, Baronet, Sir William Donville, Baronet, Aldermen of the said City, John Silvester, Esq.
