Whereas it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that on Saturday evening the 3d instant, about seven o'clock, the body of Mr. Thomas Putnam, who had been shot through the head, was discovered lifeless in Greenwich Park; and that from the circumstance of no pistol or gun having been found near the body, and of his death having been clearly occasioned by a ball fired from a gun or pistol, there is every reason to believe he has been murdered;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in such murder, is hereby pleased, in the name and

on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually fired such gun or pistol), who shall discover his or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of ONE HUNDRED GUINEAS is hereby offered to any person (except as is before excepted) who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof, or to any person or persons who shall apprehend and bring the said offenders, or any of them, to conviction, or cause them, or any of them, so to be apprehended and convicted as aforesaid.—Such reward of one hundred guineas to be paid by the inhabitants of the parish of Greenwich.
