## From Gonday February 20. to dourgDay February 23. 1681.

OStockbolme, チan, 254 N Monday lalt the Ratifications of the Treaty of Guaranty, conctuded between this King and the StatesGeneral of the United-Provinces, were exchanged here by the Minifters of this Crown and the Dutch Refident. The Frelich Ambafiajor has had his Audience of Leave of the King, in order to his return home.

Alicant, Finn. 24. Since the takıng of the Golden Iyon of Argiers the Adventure, Captain Booth and the Fames Gally, Caprain Sbouel, have deltroyed another Algerime, being a new fhip of 34 Guns, called the Flowerpot, carrying 300 M n. The Frigats met with the laid Algerine about twelve Leagues off of Cape de Gutr, and chaced her to the Barbary shore, where they gained fo much upon her, that fhe was forced to run afhure near Mafagran, which happening in the night, the Frigats durft not bear noar enough the Shore to binder the Turks from faving themfelves, which they did before Morning nope remaining on board but three Chriftians, an Englifloman, a Portuguefe, and a Flemmin, who it feems had concealed themfelves in the hurry; as foon as it was Day light the Frigats fent thcir Boats on bbard, who. fet Fire to the Algerine, and ftaid by her till fhe was burne to the $W$ aters edge.

Vienna, Feb. 12. The emperor bas made choice of the Officers of the new Regiments, which we told you in our laft, his Imperial Majefty had refolved to raife, and we are affured the Moneys for that Service are ready, and will in few days be diftributed among the Officers that are to make the Levies, who for that purpole are come hither: When thefe new Forces are raifed, the Emperor will hâre a very great Army on Foot. It is faid that the Count of Herberjleyn is to have the Command of Colonel Ceneral of the Croats in the Emperors Service, which are to confilt in four Regiments. Ihe Baren de Leleincroon, Envoye ExtraOrdinary from the King of Denmark, has had his firl Audience of the Emperor, and it is difcour $\tilde{f} d$ that he comis's to propofe a Defenfive Alliance, bet een his. Imperial Majefly and the King his Malter. Count Matmefertr, the Emperors Minifter at Paris, having hat very little fuccefs in his Negotiations at that Coutt, is recalled.
Berlin, Feb.9. The Dike and Dutchefs of Fanouer alten having been Entertaincd by' our EleCtor and Eleotarefs aith great State and Magnificence, are retarnect fiome. Leotics arenow making in molt parts of Germanys for the Service of the Emperor;and fevetal other Princes of the Empire, who bcfides their Quota's of the Army fithe Empire, feem reflved to heep fimal Arrices on foots make ute theriof
according to the exigency of ARairs. - The Meeting at Erancfort has not (fince the Propoals the French Ambaffadors made) produced any thing of moment; por is there much ground to expect any good effect of thofe Conferences; though we are told that fome Princes of the Empire think it beft in the prefent juncture of Affairs, to clofe with the French inpon the faid Propifals.
Hamburg, Feb. 17. From Berlin they write, that Mr. Poley the King of Englands Refident at that Court, was gone from thence for Francfort: And that the Sicur d'Ameromgen, Envoye' Extraordinary from the States-General of the United Travinces, was $\mu$ pon his departure for the Court of Saxony. Froun $S_{\text {poeden }}$ we have an Account, that the Ratifications of the Treaty lately concluded between that Crown and the States-Generat, were exchanged. And that the King of Swedenthad recalled his Ambalfador now in France. The D ike and Dutcliefs of Hanouer are returned to Hanouer very well pleat ed with their kind and noble Entertainmentat Berlin; 'but the expectation many Had, that the meeting of there two Princes would have produced fome important Refolutions, with relation to the prefent Affairs, feems not to have been anfwered. The old Duke of Courlarsd is Dead, and his son fucceeds him.

Cologne, Feb. 17. The Bithop of Strasburg parted from hence yefterday for Bome, to be prefene ${ }^{2}$ the mecting of the States of this Archbilhopridk, and to propore feveral things to them on the part of his Electoral Highnefs. The Deputits of hig Electoral Highness, and throfe of the Dike of fut. liers have had feveral Mectings to adjuft the-Difth rences concerring the Limits. From Fraxcfort they write, that the Circle of Frayconith had godt Men ready to take the Field, in cafe.th-relbe otea- , fion for it. That the Circle of the tupper Ebine had 8000. And that the Elector of Bavaria had refolve凶 to maintain 12000 on bis dwh charge for the Service of the Empire. From entisbonse the haye an account, That the Deputies of the Elector of Brandenburg had on the 9th Inflant reprefented to the EleCtoral Colledge, That, as things now food in the Empire, his Etceloral Highnefi' troorght no opportunity of coming to a good Agreement ought to $b \rightarrow$ neglected, but oughe tathet to be preferred to a new', a.ld dangerods Wart and that they had propofed the following voreftil ors. Whetber in the prefont juntlure of Affais they could bave ariy Affutance' of retoudting the Places and Countreys already pofffed by ${ }^{7}$ Prance. Whetber their bopes of पuecruering what is alneady ${ }^{4}$ lof, were more certain than the danger of tofing more. And Laffiy whether it woas not hation to think of preferuing wobat remains, tben to bazard a War, and whereby the
total Ruine of ithe stares of the Empire, feeing the $f_{\text {uccefs of }}$ War is fo ancertain.

E-ufits, Feb. :7. The Pri ce of Parma is preparing for the executing the Orders he Has received froin Spatn to relieve the City of Luxemburg, ard has ordired all the Tioops that are in Flanders to be in a readinefs to march. We hiave an acsuuns from E'olland, that Monficur d' Agurto was arrived at the Hagus, but that he had not yet feen the Prince of orange, his Highnefs being at seefld de; upon the fuccefs of his Commiffion much will depee.g. In the mean time we hear that the French, upicn what is given out of our defign to relieve Luxemburg, are drawing their Troops together near Charleville. The Count $d$ 'Arcbinto is gone this Morning for Antwerp, to Treat with the Bankers there abcut raifing fome Moncys. Monficar Fariau is made a Maj r-Gerferal of the Impeiid Army, and has a Regiment of 2500 Mcn befidc. The rrench had flopt the Polt that paffes peiwe en this Place and Luxemburg, but havenow again permitted it to go as formerly.
bague, Feb. 28. We have already tch yous that the Siani, i Envoye herc had Declared to the StatesGeneral, that the Prince of Parma had received pofitive Orders from the Courr at Madvid, to enderavour the relief of Iuxemburg; that in order thereunto he had demanded the affifance of this State, and that the states of Holland were Adjournect, without coming to any Refolution in the Matter. Since, Mi nfieur d' Agurto, General of the Artillery in Flanders, is arrived here, being fent by the Prince of Parma, farther to prefs the States to give him the faid affiflance; but according to all appearance the difpofitio's here tend not to the bringing things to extremitics. The Deputies fir Forrecten Affiars have had a Conf rence with the French Ambalador, upon the fubject of the M. marial he lateJy prefented to the States, conticerning, Luxemburg. Count-Nafjau General of the Horfe in the Sertice of thefe Provinces, is arrived here fiom Germany. The Heer Deagb, late Ambaffador from the Crown of Denmarke, in France, is come hither from Flanders.
Payis, Ebeb. 2 s. The Refident of Genoud, ina late Audience he had of the King acquainted his Majefty, that he bad Orders fromthe Republick, to Iet bis Majefly know, that for what concerns the pretenfipns of the Counts de Fiesque, the Republick did wholly refer thcmecleses to his Majeflics âteerminatipon. It is the general faying here, that there is a Yery good correfpondence between this Court and the Elector of trandenburg, and tbat his Electoral Highnefs is to rec-ive very confiderable sabfidies fre mi this Crown.
