A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, P. R.

THEREAS a great number of disorderly persons have, during the three last days, publicly assembled themselves together in a riotous and tumultuous manner, and have been guilty of many violent and criminal acts and proceedings, having attacked the persons and houses of many of His Majesty's loyal subjects in several parts of the city of Westminster and county of Middlesex, and especially in the evenings and during the nights of the said three days; We, therefore, taking the same into Our most serious consideration, and being fully determined on Our part to use all means in Our power to protect the lives and properties of His Majesty's loyal subjects, to preserve the public peace, and to bring to condign punishment the authors of such violences, have thought fit, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, it is enacted, that it shall not be lawful for any

to issue this Proclamation, and thereby strictly to exhort, charge, and command all His Majesty's loyal subjects to give their assistance in discountenancing and suppressing all such criminal acts and proceedings, and to give all information to the Magistrates, by which the disturbers of His Majesty's peace may be brought to punishment: and We do hereby enjoin and require all Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Mayors, Bailiffs, Constables, and all other His Majesty's loving subjects, to be aiding and assisting to the utmost of their power, in suppressing such criminal acts and proceedings, and in detecting, apprehending, and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the same : and for the better detection of any person or persons who were or may be concerned in any such criminal acts and proceedings, We are graciously pleased to promise, that if any person shall discover any other person or persons who, directly or indirectly, was or were, or may be concerned therein, so as that the person or persons discovered may be prosecuted for the same, such discoverer shall have and receive as a reward, upon conviction of such offender or offenders, the sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, and also His Majesty's gracious pardon for the said offence, in case the person making such discovery shall himself be liable to be prosecuted for the same.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, this ninth day of March one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, in the fifty-fifth year of His Majesty's reign.

HEREAS the time limited by the Order of His Royal Highness the Pance Regent in Courted of the twenty-third day of July last, for prohibiting the exportation out of this kingdom, or carrying coastwise, ganpowder of salt petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, has expired; and whereas it is judged expedicit for His Majesty's service, and the safety of this kingdom, that the said probabilition should be continued for some time longer; His Royal Highness, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's service) do, at any time during the space of Six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport into any parts out of this kingdom, or carry coastwise, any gunpowder or salt petre, or lade any gunpowder or salt petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, or ship or lade any gunpowder or salt petre, or any sort of hemis or ammunition, on board any-ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any

parts beyond the seas, or carrying the same coastwise, without leave or permission in that be-half first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon pain of lacurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of His Lite Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to empower "His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of salt "petre, and to enforce the law for empowering "His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of guapowder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the · carrying coastwise of salt petre, gunpowder, or " any sort of arms or ammunition :" But it is His Royal Highness's pleasure, that nothing in this Order contained shall prevent the exportation of any of the articles, specified in the Order in Council of the twentieth of May one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, to the coast of Africa, under the conditions contained in the said Order. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively ap-Jas. HEREAS the time limited by the Order of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council of the twenty-third day of July last, prohibiting, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, the transporting into any parts out of this kingdom of any pig iton, bar iron, hemp, pitch, tar, rosin, turpentine, anchors, cables, cordage, masts, yards, bowsprits, cars, 'oakum, or other naval stores, has expired; and whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's service, and the safety of this kingdom, that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whosoever do, at any time for the space of six months from the date of this Order, presume to transport into any parts out of this kingdom, any pig iron, bar iron, hemp, pitch, tar, rosin, turpentine, anchors, cables, cordage, masts, yards, bowsprits, oars, oakum, sail-cloth or canvas, or other naval stores (sheet copper excepted), or do ship or lade any pig iron, bar iron, hemp, pitch, tar, rosin, turpentine, anchors, cables, cordage, masts, yards, bowsprits, oars, oakum, sailcloth or canvas, or other naval stores (sheet copper excepted), on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any parts beyond the seas

without leave or permission first being had and ob-1 tained from His Majesty or His Privy Council upon pain of incurring the forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His Majestr's reign, intituled, "An Act to enable ¹⁴ His Majestr to restrain the exportation of naval ¹⁴ stores, and more effectually to prevent the ex-¹⁴ portation of salt petre, arms, and ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council;" But it is nevertheless His Royal Highness's pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's ships of war, or any other ships or vessels or boats in the service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any ship or vessel from taking or having on board such quantities of naval stores as may be accessary for the use of such ship or vessel during the course of her intended yoyage, or by herence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the time being; nor to the exportation of the said several articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's yards or gaurisons, or to His Majesty's colonies and plantations in America or the West Indies. or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's forts and settlements on the coast of Africa, or to the island of Saint Helena, or to the British settlements or factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the exportation of any of the said articles for the purposes of trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's yards and garrisons, or to His Majesty's colonies and plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's forts and settlements on the coast of Africa, or to the island of Saint Helena, or to the British settlements or factories in the East Indies, the exporters of such articles do first make oath of the true destination of the same to the places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and suffi-cient security by bond (except as hereinafter excepted), to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said articles to the places for which they are so entered outwards, and for the purposes specified, and none other; and such bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until proof be made to the satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the production, within a time to be fixed by the said Commissioners and specified in the bond, of a certificate or certificates, in such form and manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said articles have been all duly landed at the places for which they were entered outwards. But it is His Royal Highness's pleasure, nevertheless, that the following articles, viz. bar iron, white and tarred rope, tallow or mill grease, tarpaulins for waggon covers, pitch, tar, and tur-pentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon payment of the proper duties, without bond being entered into by the merohant exporter, to any of the British plantations in the West Indies, or to any of His Majesty's settlements in South America; provided the merchant exporter shall first verify, upon oath, that the articles so exported are, intended for the use of a particular plantation or

settlement, to be named in the entry outwards, and not for sale, and that the said plantation or settlement has not before been furnished with any supply of the said articles during the same season; and provided also that the exportation of the said articles shall in no case exceed the value of fifty pounds sterling for any given plantation or settlement, whether by one or more shipments, within the same season: and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the new cessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

THEREAS by an Act, passed in the forty-Ŵ sixth year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled " An Act for altering and en-" larging the powers of an Act, made in the forty-" third year of His present Majesty, for the further " improvement of the port of London, by making " docks and other works at Blackwall, for the " accommodation of the East India shipping in " the said port," it is (amongst other things) reeited and enacted as follows :
