WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the twenty-Weighth year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the "trade between the subjects of His Majesty's "colonies and plantations in North America and " in the West India Islands and the countries be-" longing to the United States of America, and between His Majesty's said subjects and the "Foreign Islands in the West Indies," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from time to time, to authorise, or by Warrant or Warrants under His sign manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland for the time being, to authorise, in case of necessity, the importation into Newfoundiand of bread, flour, Indian coru, and live stock, from any of the tarritories belong-ing to the said United States, for the supply of the inhabitants and fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then ensuing season only; provided always, that such bread, flour, Indian corn, and live stock, so authorised to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported the Island of Newfoundamy, shall not be imported except in conformity to such rules, regulations, and restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants respectively, and except by British subjects, and in British-built ships, owned by His Majcoty's subjects, and navisated according to law :

And whereas it is expedient and necessary, that provision be made for fully supplying the inhabitants and fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing season, with bread, flour, pease, Indian corn, and live stock, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent doth thereupon, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that for the supply of the inhabitants and fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing season only, bread, flour, pease, Indian corn, and live stock, may be imported into the said island from any of the territories belonging to the said United States, by British subjects, and in British-bhilt ships, owned by His Majesty's subjects, and navigated according to law, and which within the space of nine months previous to the time of such importation, have cleared out from some port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain or Ireland, or other His Majesty's of theat priate or retaine, or other the majory of dominions in Europe, for which purpose a licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other person or persons who may be duly authorised in that kingdom respectively, in the manner and form herein-after mentioned ; which licence shall continue and he in force for nine calendar months from the day of the date upon which such licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no such licence as aforesaid, granted after the thirtieth day of September next, shall be of any force or effect : and His Royal Highness is hereby further pleased to order, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that the master or person having the charge or command of any ship or varsal to whom such light a difference with of any ship or vessel to whom such licence shall be granted, shall, upon the arrival of the said ship or vessel at the port, harbour, or place in the said Island of Newfoundland where he shall discharge such bread, flour, pease, Indian corn, and live stock, deliver up the said licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs there, having first indorsed on the back of such licence the marks, numbers, and contents of each

A PROCLAMATION,

Declaring the Cessation of Arms, as well by Sea as Land, agreed upon between His Majesty and the United States of America, and enjoining the observance thereof.

GEORGE, P. R.

/HEREAS a Treaty of Peace and Amity, between His Majesty and the United States of America, was signed at Ghent on the twentytourth day of December last, by the Plenipotentiaries of His Majesty and the Plenipotentigries of the United States' And whereas, for the putting an end to the calamities of War, ins some, and as far as may be possible, it linth been agreed between His Majesty and the said United States as follows ; that is to say, that immediately the the natifica-tions of the said Trenty, friendship bould the established belywein His Majesty and the said United States, by sea and fladt, in abiputs of the world; and, in order to prevent all causes of complaint and dispute which thight arise with respect to prizes that might be taken at sea after the said matheations of the said Treaty, sit has also been neciprocally agreed, that all vessels and efforts which may be taken after the space of twelvestays from the said ratifications, upon all parts of the coasts of North America from the latitude of twentys three degrees

north to the latitude of fifty degrees north, and as far eastward in the Atlantic Octan as the thirty-sixth degree of west longitude from the meridian of Greenwich, shall be restored on each side; that the time shall be thirty days in all other parts of the Atlantic Ocean north of the Equinoctial Line of Equator, and the same time for the British and Irish Channels, for the Gulf of Mexico, and all parts of the West Indies; forty days for the North Seas, for the Baltic, and for all parts of the Mediterranean; sixty days for the Atlantic Ocean south of the Equator, as far as the latitude of the Cape of Good Hope; ninety days for every other pant of the world south of the Equator; and one hundred and twenty days for all other parts of the world without exception : And whereas the ratifi-cations of the said Treaty were exchanged on the seventeenth day of last month, from which day the several terms abovementioned of twelve days, thirty days, forty days, sixty days, ninety days, and one hundred and twenty days, are to be computed; appy, in order that the several epochs fixed as afore-said, between His Majesty and the said United States, should be generally known and observed, We have thought fit, in the name and on the behalf 'of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to notify the same to His Majesty's loving subjects, and We do hereby, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, strictly charge and command all His Majesty's Officers both at sea and land, and all other His Majesty's subjects whatsoever, that they forbear all acts of hostility, either by sea or land, against the United States of America, or the citizens thereof, under the penalty of incurring His Majesty's highest displeasure.
