Lisbowne, Eeb. 2.

GReat preparations are making here for the Reception of the Duke of SaDoy, for whom the Palace d' Almeirim is furbifhed; and other Houles are provided for the Nobility that come with him : his Highnefs, as we are informed, is expected herc in the Month of May, and in his paffage hither; (which will be by Sca」 will be attended bs a Squadron of French men of War, under the Command of the Marelchal d' Eflree: The Commiflioners of this Crown, having had feveral Conferences with thofe of the King of Spain (at a place appointed for their mecting of the kroutiers) in order ta the determining the remaining differences concerning the Ifle of St. Gabriel in the wefl-Imdies, are coue back, not. having b en able to come to any agrement, foti at chis Affair, according to what was flipulated by the Treaty concladed fere by the Dake de Givvituzzo, is now to be referred to the Pope.

Madrid, Fed, 19. The i6h Inftant, the Marquifs
 Emperor, parted from hence for Fianders, being made choice of by the King of Spain, with the Emperors keave, to Command his Forces in the Spanifo Netherlends. The Inth, the Count de Vaugyon, Ambaflador fromixis the Crown of Frarce, made his publick Entry.

Gemoun, Feb. 25 . The 1 gth Inftant arrived here 11 Freneb Gallies, Commanded by the Sieur de la bretecbe. The 23. eight of them parted again for Legborne, and the other three failed yefterday for Prosence, having on board a great number of Slaves which the French Confni had bought here From Milas they write, that the Connt de Metgar, Goverror of that Countrey, is providing the Froutier places therecf, with all things neceffary for their Defence.

Vienna, March r. Two days fince arrived here.an Extraordinary Courier from Conflansimople, who, as we are informed, brings an Account, that che Turks are making great preparations, and that particulare ly they aro providing a Irain of Artillert, as is Gaid, for the Prince of Trasfyluania, who it's feared intends to fall again into Hungary. The Duke of Lorrain will flay here till Count Aransfeldt, the Enpepors late Minifter in France, arrives.
Francfort, March 8. Tbis place is foll of Ambarfadous and other Minifters, and yit litule of moment palkes here; theirtime being employed in endear vouring to adjuft feveral preliminary Matters, Which have bitherto hiadred the openitg of the Crnf reners.

Coligue, March 3. The Sicur fodocus, the Imperial Multer, is gQace trom hence to the Courts of the

Duke of folters and the Bilhop of Murffet; who are Direetors of the Circie, of weffphalia to recommend to them in the name of the Empefor, the Interefls of the Empire ; and that at the Dyet which is going to be held for that Circle at Duisberg, they will do" their part that fuch Refolutions may be taken for the fecurity of that Circle, and of the Eanpire in general, as the prefent fate of things feems to demand. The meeting of the S'ates of this Archbifhoprick at Bome ended yeflerday, they hasing, as we art informed, relolved to raike and maintain 500 Foot. and 600 Hurfe. The Bifhop of strusbourg, who affifted at that Alfembly, is not yet retarned. Two of the Depurties of the City of Liege that are here, intend to recurn home towards the end of this week, and the third is to remain here, that to the Treaty may not be wholly broke off on their part. Monfieur deferia, whó has refided feweral ycars at Rasisbonme, as the Elector of Brandeuburg's Deputy, parted from thence the 2.5 th palt, for Muxic, uponfome Affairs of great inpurtance: From Cablents they write, that Monficur de Foxsbonhodu; Euvoye from the Stench King, was arrived there, and had bad an Aadience of the Elettor of Trier; and that prefently after the pad Cent ${ }^{2}$ ar Exprefs tor fiancern.
