# From Thursday March 9. to Donday March 13.1681.

## Lisbonne, Feb. 2.

Reat preparations are making here for the Reception of the Duke of Savoy, for whom the Palace d' Almeirim is furnished; and other Houses are provided for the Nobility that come with him : his Highness, as we are informed, is expected here in the Month of May, and in his paffage hither; (which will be by Sea ) will be attended by a Squadron of French men of War, under the Command of the Mareichal d' Effree: The Commissioners of this Crown, having had feveral Conferences with those of the King of Spain (at a place appointed for their meeting on the Frontiers) in order to the determining the remaining differences concerning the Ific of St. Gabriel in the West-Indies, are come back, not, having been able to come to any agreement, fo ti at this Affair, according to what was flipulated by the Treaty concluded here, by the Duke de Giuvinazzo, is now to be referred to the Pope.

Madrid, Feb. 19. The 16th Inflant, the Marquifs de Grans, who it fided here is Ambailador from the Emperor, parted from hence for Fiander's, being made choice of by the King of Spain, with the Emperors kave, to Command his Forces in the Spanifs Netherlands. The 14th, the Count de Vaugyon, Ambaffador from the Crown of France, made his publick Entry.

Genous, Feb. 25. The 19th Inflat arrived here 11 French Gallies, Commanded by the Sieur de la Breteche. The 23. eight of them parted again for Leghorne, and the other three failed yefferday for Provence, having on board a great number of Slaves which the French Confui had bought here. From Milen they write, that the Connt de Meigar, Governor of that Countrey, is providing the Froutier places thereof, with all things neceffary for their Defence.

Vienna, March I. Two days fince arrived here an Extraordinary Courier from Conflaminople, who, as we are informed, brings an Account, that the Turks are making great preparations, and that particularly they are providing a Train of Artillery, as is faid, for the Prince of Transfuturia, who it's feared intends to fall again into Hungary. The Duke of Lorvain will flay here till Count Mansfeldt, the Empepors late Minister in France, arrives.

Francfort, March 8. This place is full of Ambalfado s and other Ministers, and yet little of moment patters here; their time being employed in endeavouring to adjust feveral preliminary Matters, which have hitherto hindred the opening of the Conf rences.

Cologue, March 3. The Sicur Fodocus, the Imperial Muniter, is gone from hence to the Courts of the

Duke of fulters and the Bilhop of Munifier, who are Directors of the Circle, of Wellphalia to recom-mend to them in the name of the Empeter, the Interests of the Empire; and that at the Dyet which is going to be held for that Circle at Duisberg, they will do their part that fuch Refolutions may be ta-ken for the fecurity of that Circle, and of the Empire in general, as the prefent flate of things feems to demand. The meeting of the States of this Archbishoprick at Bonne coded yesterday, they having, as we are informed, relolved to raile and maintain 2500 Foot, and 600 Horfe. The Bilhop of Studsbourg, who affilted at that Allembly, is not yet returned. Two of the Deputies of the City of Liege that are here, intend to return home towards the end of this week, and the third is to remain here, that fo the Treaty may not be wholly broke off on their part. Monficur de Fena, who has refided feveral years at Ratubonne, as the Elector of Brandenburg's Deputy, parted from thence the 25th pall, for Munic, upon some Affairs of great importance. From Coblems they write, that Monsieur de Fonsbonseau; Envoye from the French King, was arrived there, and had had an Audience of the Elector of Trier, and that prefently after the had leavent Ex-prefs for Francism. Hague, March 14. The fath Infland the States of

Holland met for the first time, fince their last Recess they were that day, as also the following, feveral hours together, his Highness the Prince of Orange being present, and having frioufly debated the Matter, before them (the most important of which is faid to be that of the Affiltance demanded with fa much carneline is by the Spanish Ministers here, in order to the relief of Luxemburg) they Adjourned till Monday next, and in the mean time the Deputies are gone home to confult their Principals In an Affair of fo great confequence. From Germany we have an Account; that feveral Princes of the Empire raife Men, in order to the putting them-felves into a pollure to act, in cafe there be occafion, for the Defence and Security of the Empire; but that at the fame time, the Debates at the Dyet at Retictionne, concerning the bringing the Army of the Empire into the Field, take up much time, by reafon of the difficulties that are by fome purpolely railed to obfiruct that work.

Hagne, March 17. The States of Holland met again yellerday: and have had a very ferious Debate, concerning the Affair of Luxenburg; most of the Towns incline to an Accommodation of that Marter.

Paris, March 14. The 11th Inftant Mr. Saville, Envoye Extraordinary from His Majefly of Great Brittain, had his Audiences of Leave of the King, the Queen, Ge. and weare now expecting his Succeflor the Lord Viccount Prefer. This week was published here a Bull for an Universal Jubily, Granted by the Pope, fon the imploring the Divine Benediction upon the Church in its prefent neceflity; It is to begin the Eighteenth, and to end the Thirty fulf. From Flanders we have an Account. that a Body of 16000 Meh was encamped at Arlon near Luxenburg, under the Comma d of the Mareichal de Crequi, to observe the motions of the Spatish Troops, and to hinder their putting any Provisions into Luxemburg.

Portimoteb, Marchy, Yeflerday the Right Honourable the Lord Noel came hither, and took poffeffitdf his Government. His Lordlhip was met in the Motning at Poff-Bridge by feveral Gentlemen, Intabitants here on Horleback, and on this fide of the Bridge by a Troop of Horfe; and foon afterwards by the Mayor and the Corporation: his Lordfhip hafving received, and returned Mr. Mayors Compli-

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ment, came out of his Coach and took Horfe, and being accompanied with Mr. Mayor, and a great numb.r of Gentlemen of the County (making a Body of about foo Horfe) continued his way hither. Being come to the Gate, it was flut, the Deputy-Governor being without to receive his Lordfhip, who having thewed his Commifion, the Gate was opened, and his Lordfhip entring the Town, paffed the Parade, where the Garrifon was drawn up, and from thence marched to the Green, where they Exercifed; which done, his Lordfhip was D.clared Governor, amidft the repeated ihouts of the Soldiers, the Great Guns were difcharged, the Bells rung, and all other publick Refpects were fhown his Lordfhip on this occafion.

Whitebal, March 3. Upon Information this day given in Council, That on the second of February last, the Officers of the High. Sheriff of Lancashire, having dilfrained the Cattle and other Goods of divers Convicted Popifh Reculants, living at Altearr near Ormeskerke in that County, for their Forfestures, were in their return with the faid Goods, Fiotoufly Af-faulted in the High-way by the faid Popish Recufants and their Abettors ; and the Goods not only refcued from them, but they beaten and wounded in fuch manner, that the recovery of forme of them was much doubted. His Majefty was pleafed to order the Judges that go that Circuit, to caufe fuch of the faid Offenders, as are already in cuftody, to be proceeded against for the same, according to the utmost feverity of the Law, and to endeavour the apprehending of all others concerned therein, by re warding the Discoverers of them, that so they may receive an Exemplary punifihment.

Wellminster, March 10. This day Captain Fratz; George Borotski, and John Sterne, the Murtherers of Mr. Thinne, were, according to the Sentence passed upon them at the Old-Bailey, executed in the Pall-Mall, where they committed that barbarous Fact; and the Body of George Borotski (whose hand did the Muther) is by His Majestie's Command to be hung up in Chains.

Newmarket, March II. We have an Account, by an Express, That his Royal Highnet's Landed at Yarmouth yefferday in the Evening; that he lay last night at Normich; and that He will be here this Evening.

Whitehal, Mareb 12, Yefterday in the Evening the Marquils de Grana arrived here from Fi mouth; and this Afternoon he Embarked again on his Grace the Duke of Grafion's Yacht, the Ifabella, for Fianders.
