**A** New Great Seal for the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland having been prepared by His Majesty's Chief Engraver of Seals, in pursuance of a warrant to him for that purpose under His Majesty's royal signature, and the same having been this day presented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council, and approved by His Royal Highness, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty; and the old Great Seal being delivered up to His Royal Highness by the Right Honourable John Lord Eldon, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the same was defaced in His Royal Highness's presence; and His Royal Highness was thereupon pleased to deliver to his Lordship the said new seal, and to direct, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, that the same shall be made use of for sealing all things whatever which pass the Great Seal. *Chetwynd.*

**A**T the Court at *Carlton-House*, the 20th of July 1815,

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

**W**HEREAS the time limited by the Order of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council of the thirteenth day of February last, for prohibiting the exportation out of this kingdom, or carrying coastwise, gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, will expire on the thirteenth day of August next; and whereas it is judged expedient for His Ma-

esty's service, and the safety of this kingdom, that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Royal Highness, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's service) do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the said thirteenth day of August next), presume to transport into any parts out of this kingdom, or carry coastwise, any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, or ship or lade any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any parts beyond the seas, or carrying the same coastwise, without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of salt-petre, and to enforce the law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of gunpowder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to enable His Majesty to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre, gunpowder, or any sort of arms or ammunition:" But it is His Royal Highness's pleasure, that nothing in this Order contained shall prevent the exportation of any of the articles, specified in the Order in Council of the twentieth of May one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, to the coast of Africa, under the conditions contained in the said Order. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. *Chetwynd.*

**A**T the Court at *Carlton-House*, the 20th of July 1815,

**PRESENT,**

His Royal Highness the **PRINCE REGENT** in Council.

**W**HEREAS the time limited by the Order of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council of the thirteenth of February last, prohibiting, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, the transporting into any parts out of this kingdom of any pig iron, bar iron, hemp, pitch, tar, rosin, turpentine, anchors, cables, cordage, masts, yards, bowsprits, oars, oakum, sail-cloth, or canvas, or other naval stores (sheet-copper excepted), will expire on the thirteenth day of August next; and whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's service, and the safety of this kingdom, that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whosoever do, at any time for the space of six months, to commence from the said thirteenth day of August next, presume to transport into any parts out of this kingdom, any pig iron, bar iron, hemp, pitch, tar, rosin, turpentine, anchors, cables, cordage, masts, yards, bowsprits, oars, oakum, sail-cloth or canvas, or other naval stores (sheet copper excepted), or do ship or lade any pig iron, bar iron, hemp, pitch, tar, rosin, turpentine, anchors, cables, cordage, masts, yards, bowsprits, oars, oakum, sail-cloth or canvas, or other naval stores (sheet copper excepted), on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any parts beyond the seas, without leave or permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring the forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the exportation of naval stores, and more effectually to prevent the exportation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council;" But it is nevertheless His Royal Highness's pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's ships of war, or any other ships or vessels or boats in the service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any ship or vessel from taking or having on board such quantities of naval stores as may be necessary for the use of such ship or vessel during the course of her intended voyage, or by licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the time being; nor to the exportation of the said several articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's yards or garrisons, or to His Majesty's colonies and plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's forts and settlements on the coast of Africa, or to the island

of Saint Helena, or to the British settlements or factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the exportation of any of the said articles for the purposes of trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's yards and garrisons, or to His Majesty's colonies and plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's forts and settlements on the coast of Africa, or to the island of Saint Helena, or to the British settlements or factories in the East Indies, the exporters of such articles do first make oath of the true destination of the same to the places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient security by bond (except as hereinafter excepted), to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said articles to the places for which they are so entered outwards, and for the purposes specified, and none other; and such bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until proof be made to the satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the production, within a time to be fixed by the said Commissioners and specified in the bond, of a certificate or certificates, in such form and manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said articles have been all duly landed at the places for which they were entered outwards. But it is His Royal Highness's pleasure, nevertheless, that the following articles, viz. bar iron, white and tarred rope, tallow or mill grease, tarpaulins for waggon covers, pitch, tar, and turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon payment of the proper duties, without bond being entered into by the merchant exporter, to any of the British plantations in the West Indies, or to any of His Majesty's settlements in South America; provided the merchant exporter shall first verify, upon oath, that the articles so exported are intended for the use of a particular plantation or settlement, to be named in the entry outwards, and not for sale, and that the said plantation or settlement has not before been furnished with any supply of the said articles during the same season; and provided also that the exportation of the said articles shall in no case exceed the value of fifty pounds sterling for any given plantation or settlement, whether by one or more shipments, within the same season: and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

**T**HE following Address has been presented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent; which Address His Royal Highness was pleased to receive very graciously:

Unto His Royal Highness the **PRINCE REGENT** of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

The humble and dutiful Address of the Right

Honourable the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the City of Edinburgh.

WE, His Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the City of Edinburgh, beg leave to approach your Royal Highness with sentiments of the warmest affection to your Royal Person, and, with the most profound respect, to offer our congratulations on the splendid and decisive victory with which it hath pleased Almighty God to crown the exertions of His Majesty's arms.

We have seen with indignation an unprincipled usurper, in defiance of a solemn treaty, attempt to re-assume that empire which he had abdicated, and endeavour to satiate the rapacity of a perjured army, by renewing those scenes of devastation by which he had formerly laid waste the Continent of Europe.

The heroic achievements of the British army, led on by the immortal Wellington, have confounded the gigantic plans of the presumptuous adventurer, have replaced the legitimate Sovereign on the throne of France, and opened up the prospect of returning peace to heal the wounds of the afflicted nations of Europe.

It is with exulting hearts that we congratulate your Royal Highness that the line of politics, for so many years pursued by the Government of this country, and acted upon in the late emergency with increased vigour, has afforded to our heroic countrymen an opportunity of displaying a gallantry hitherto unparalleled, and of raising Great Britain to the first rank among the nations.

We venerate the Sovereign, crowned with years and glory, under whose paternal care the noble career of triumph was begun. We contemplate with the pride of conscious freedom your Royal Highness maintaining the rights, establishing the privileges, and thus animating the exertions and advancing the happiness of your brave and loyal people, who will ever reflect with satisfaction on the dignified attitude which the British empire has attained under your Royal Highness's Government.

THE Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed money for the payment of half-pay to Sea Officers from the 1st April to the 30th June 1815, according to His Majesty's establishment in that behalf; these are to give notice, that the several payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at ten o'clock in the morning, on the following days, viz.

On Monday the 14th and Tuesday the 15th of August, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

Where Officers are abroad on leave, their agents are to produce attested copies of such leave, before the half-pay can be paid.

And as by Act of Parliament, passed in the thirty-fifth year of His present Majesty's reign, intitled, "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the twentieth clause of the said Act, "that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near the place of his residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, in London, to have such Half-Pay paid at or near the place of his residence, &c. in the manner pointed out by the said Act;" notice is hereby further given, that the half-pay ending the 30th of June 1815, will commence paying on the 14th instant; and all persons desirous of having their half-pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.
