wares, or merchandise when experted to the faid States in British vessels, and some other or higher duties; and it is hereby further ordered, that, on the exportation from this kingdom to the United States, of any goods, wares, or merchandise, of the growth, production, or manufacture of His Majesty's territories in Europe, in vessels of the said States, there shall be paid and allowed the same bounties as are paid and allowed of sich goods, wares, and merchandise when emorted to the said States in British vessels: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
