PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty, until six weeks after the commencement of the next session of Parliament, to regulate the trade and commerce carried on between His Majesty's subjects and the inhabitants of the United States of America," His Majesty in Council is authorised, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from time to time, to give such directions, and to make such regulations with respect to duties, drawbacks, or otherwise for carrying on the trade and commerce between the people and territories belonging to the Crown of Great Britain and the people and territories of the said United States, as to His Majesty in Council shall appear most expedient and necessary; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is therefore pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the date of this Order, until six weeks after the commencement of the next session of Parliament, there shall be paid on the importation into this kingdom from the territories of the United States of America, in vessels of the said States, of any goods, wares, or merchandise, being of the growth, production, or manufacture of the said territories, the same duties of Customs that are by them payable on such goods, wares, or merchandise when imported from the United States in British vessels, and no other or higher duties of Customs; and it is hereby further ordered, that on the exportation of any goods, wares, or merchandise, the growth, production, or manufacture of His Majesty's territories in Europe from this kingdom to the territories of the United States, in vessels of the said States, there shall be paid the same duties as are by law payable on such goods,

wares, or merchandise, when exported to the said States in British vessels, and some other or higher duties; and it is hereby further ordered, that, on the exportation from this kingdom to the United States, of any goods, wares, or merchandise, of the growth, production, or manufacture of His Majesty's territories in Europe, in vessels of the said States, there shall be paid and allowed the same bounties as are paid and allowed on such goods, wares, and merchandise when exported to the said States in British vessels: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly. *Chelwynd.*

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of FIFTY POUNDS is hereby offered to any person or persons (except as before excepted) who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof; or to any person or persons who shall apprehend and bring the said offenders, or any of them, to conviction, or cause them, or any of them, so to be apprehended and convicted as aforesaid; such reward to be paid by Anthony Harrison, Esq. of Barnard Castle.
