

The oats to be good, sweet, dry, and clean, without any mixture of fox or mowburnt oats, and must not weigh less than 37lb. Winchester bushel.

The hay to be sweet and dry, and delivered in trusses of 56lb weight.

The straw to be good, clean, and dry wheat or rye straw, and delivered in trusses of 36lb weight.

The prices to be paid for the respective quantities of each article which may be delivered, at the following rates, viz.

For the oats, at £ hundred pounds, avoirdupois weight.

For the hay, at £ hundred and twelve pounds.

For the straw, at £ hundred and twelve pounds.

The proposals may be delivered separately or jointly for two or more of the said districts; and it is expected that the contractor shall receive the stable dung which, during the period of his contract, may accumulate, making an allowance for the same, after the rate of £ horse per week.
