**O**UR will and pleasure is, that all French vessels and cargoes that may have been captured or detained by reason of the late declaration of hostilities against France, on any voyage to or from Martinique or Marseilles, and also all vessels and cargoes captured on a voyage from any French port at which the white flag was hoisted at the time when the vessel sailed from her port of lading, shall be released forthwith, on payment of such expences as have been duly incurred in consequence of such capture or detention.

Given at the Palace of Carlton-House, this twenty-sixth day of August one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, in the fifty-fifth year of Our reign.

**A**T the Court at Carlton-House, the 17th of August 1815,

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

**W**HEREAS by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty, until six weeks after the commencement of the next session of Parliament, to regulate the trade and commerce carried on between His Majesty's subjects and the inhabitants of the United States of America," His Majesty in Council is authorised, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from time to time, to give such directions, and to make such regulations with respect to duties, drawbacks, or otherwise for carrying on the trade and commerce between the people and territories belonging to the Crown of Great Britain

and the people and territories of the said United States, as to His Majesty in Council shall appear most expedient and salutary; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is thereupon pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the date of this Order, until six weeks after the commencement of the next session of Parliament, there shall be paid on the importation into this kingdom from the territories of the United States of America, in vessels of the said States, of any goods, wares, or merchandise, being of the growth, production, or manufacture of the said territories, the same duties of Customs that are by them payable on such goods, wares, or merchandise when imported from the United States in British vessels, and no other or higher duties of Customs; and it is hereby further ordered, that on the exportation of any goods, wares, or merchandise, the growth, production, or manufacture of His Majesty's territories in Europe from this kingdom to the territories of the United States, in vessels of the said States, there shall be paid the same duties as are by law payable on such goods, wares, or merchandise when exported to the said States in British vessels, and none other or higher duties; and it is hereby further ordered, that, on the exportation from this kingdom to the United States, of any goods, wares, or merchandise, of the growth, production, or manufacture of His Majesty's territories in Europe, in vessels of the said States, there shall be paid and allowed the same bounties as are paid and allowed on such goods, wares, and merchandise when exported to the said States in British vessels: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly. *Chetwynd.*

This day His Excellency the Count de Funchal, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the Prince Regent of Portugal, had his audience of leave of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent; to which he was introduced by Earl Bathurst, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, in the absence of Lord Viscount Castlereagh, and conducted by Robert Chester, Esq. Assistant-Master of the Ceremonies.

The sword of state was thereupon delivered to His Royal Highness by Admiral Lord Viscount Keith, Knight Grand Cross of the Order, and Sir William Johnstone Hope, kneeling, was knighted therewith, after which he had the honour to kiss His Royal Highness's hand.

Then His Royal Highness the Duke of Clarence, Knight Grand Cross of the Order, having received from the Officer of Arms the ribband and badge of a Knight Commander, presented them to the Prince Regent, who was pleased to invest Sir William Johnstone Hope with the same; the Rear-Admiral having again had the honour to kiss the Prince Regent's hand, and having received from His Royal Highness the star of a Knight Commander, retired.

His Royal Highness has also been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to grant the dignity of a Viscount of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, to the Right Honourable Alan Hyde Lord Gardner, Vice-Admiral of the White Squadron of His Majesty's Fleet, by the name, stile, and title of Viscount Gardner.

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration, together with the relative documents, be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that about three o'clock of the afternoon of Tuesday

the 8th August, a smuggling boat, with thirteen men, full of goods, and armed, run on board the eight-oared boat belonging to the Fox cutter, in the service of the Revenue of Excise on the coast of Kent; and that the crew of the smugglers shot four of the boatmen, and, in the most brutal manner, threw them overboard, and beat, bruised, and wounded the other boatmen, and left them for dead on the wreck of their boat;

His Royal Highness, in order to bring these atrocious offenders to justice, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person having the command or direction of the said smuggling boat), who shall discover his or their accomplices, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted.
