By His Excellency Major-General George William Ramsay, Governor and Commander in Chief in and over His Britannic Majesty's Island of St. Croix, and its Dependencies, in America, Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

BY virtue of the authority in me vested, and in conformity with an ordinance of the 23d May, and an edict of the 12th August 1800, I do hereby make known, that, in compliance with a petition delivered in, I have permitted and granted, that the Executors of the deceased Daniel MacFarlane, senior, Messrs. James McNeillidge, James Todd, and William Smith,

may summon by proclama, sub pœna præclusi et perpetui silentii, all the known or unknown Creditors of the said deceased Daniel MacFarlane, senior, residing in European or American territories, to come forward with their demands, and to enter and prove their claims, in person or by their attorneys, before the said Executors, previous to the expiration of the period hereinafter limited, that is to say, within one year and six weeks from the period when this proclama shall have been recorded in the Upper Courts of the islands of St. Croix, St. Thomas, and St. John, and published three times consecutively in the London Gazette; and all such known or unknown Creditors, as reside in any of the West India islands or colonies, shall come forward with their demands, and enter and prove their claims, in person or by their attorneys, before the said Executors James McNeillidge, James Todd, and William Smith, within three months from the date of this proclama being recorded in the Superior and Inferior Courts of the islands of St. Croix, St. Thomas, and St. John, and notice thereof being published in the Santa Croix Gazette three times consecutively.
