HIS Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, has been pleased to nominate and appoint Don Miguel Alava, Lieutenant-General in the armies of His Catholic Majesty, to be an Honorary Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, in consideration of the long and zealous services of that Officer while attached to the British army in the Peninsula, under the command of Field-Marshal the Duke of Wellington.

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the said felony, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually set fire to the said corn-ricks), who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof. **SIDMOUTH.**

And, as a further encouragement, the following rewards are hereby offered, viz. **ONE HUNDRED POUNDS** by the West of England Fire and Life Insurance Company, the sum of **FIFTY POUNDS** by J. Cleveland, Esq. Lord of the Manor of Saunton, and a further sum of **FIFTY POUNDS** by the said Mr. John Hole, and **TEN POUNDS** by the Braunton Association, to any person (except as is before excepted) who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof, or to any person or persons who shall apprehend and bring the said offenders, or any of them, to conviction, or cause them, or any of them, so to be apprehended and convicted as aforesaid.
