His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to approve of Mr. Andrew Caspar Giese as Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary for the King of Prussia, in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.
