MEMBER returned to serve in this present **PARLIAMENT.**

WILLIAM Henry Ashhurst, Esq. in the room of the Right Honourable Lord Francis Almaric Spencer, now Viscount Granville, called up to the House of Peers.

Commissions in the King's Own Regiment of Militia, signed by the Lord Lieutenant of the County of Stafford.

Ensign George S. Davis to be Lieutenant, vice Russell, transferred to the Line. Dated September 30, 1815.

Charles Orange, Gent. to be Ensign, vice Poingdestre, promoted. Dated September 21, 1815.

William Legge, Gent. to be Ensign, vice Bissett, promoted. Dated October 3, 1815.

Commission in the 1st or West Norfolk Regiment of Militia, signed by the Lord Lieutenant of the County of Norfolk.

Ensign Thomas Smallpiece Clarke to be Lieutenant, vice Damant, promoted.

Commission in the Nithsdale Regiment of Local Militia, signed by the Lord Lieutenant.

Robert Richardson, Esq. to be Captain, vice Hamilton, deceased. Dated July 10, 1815.

WHereas it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that some evil disposed person or persons did on the evening of Thursday the 21st ultimo, between the hours of seven and eight, set fire to various

ricks of corn, the property of Mr. John Hole, of Saunton-Court, within the parish of Braunton, in the county of Devon, which totally destroyed the same;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the said felony, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually set fire to the said corn ricks), who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof. **SIDMOUTH.**

And, as a further encouragement, the following rewards are hereby offered, viz. **ONE HUNDRED POUNDS** by the West of England Fire and Life Insurance Company, the sum of **FIFTY POUNDS** by J. Cleveland, Esq. Lord of the Manor of Saunton, and a further sum of **FIFTY POUNDS** by the said Mr. John Hole, and **TEN POUNDS** by the Braunton Association, to any person (except as is before excepted) who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof, or to any person or persons who shall apprehend and bring the said offenders, or any of them, to conviction, or cause them, or any of them, so to be apprehended and convicted as aforesaid.

IN obedience to an Order of the Court of Lord Mayor and Aldermen, dated the 10th day of October 1815, made in pursuance of an Act of Parliament passed in the seventh year of the reign of His present Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for completing a bridge across the River Thames, from Blackfriars, in the City of London, to the opposite side, in the County of Surrey, and for other purposes therein mentioned;" and of a certain other Act of Parliament made and passed in the fifty-second year of His present Ma-
