A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, P. R.

WHEREAS the Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the second day of November next, We, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said second day of November to Thursday the first day of February next; and We have given order to the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do further hereby, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice aforesaid, publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall, on the first day of February next, be held and sit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said first day of February next.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, the nineteenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, in the fifty-fifth year of His Majesty's reign.

OUR will and pleasure is, that all French vessels and cargoes that may have been captured or detained by reason of the late declaration of

hostilities against France, on any voyage to or from Martinique or Marseilles, and also all vessels and cargoes captured on a voyage from any French port at which the white flag was hoisted at the time when the vessel sailed from her port of lading, shall be released forthwith, on payment of such expences as have been duly incurred in consequence of such capture or detention.

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty, until six weeks after the commencement of the next session of Parliament, to regulate the trade and commerce carried on between His Majesty's subjects and the inhabitants of the United States of America," His Majesty in Council is authorised, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from time to time, to give such directions, and to make such regulations with respect to duties, drawbacks, or otherwise for carrying on the trade and commerce between the people and territories belonging to the Crown of Great Britain and the people and territories of the said United States, as to His Majesty in Council shall appear most expedient and salutary; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is thereupon pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council,

to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the date of this Order, until six weeks after the commencement of the next session of Parliament, there shall be paid on the importation into this kingdom from the territories of the United States of America, in vessels of the said States, of any goods, wares, or merchandise, being of the growth, production, or manufacture of the said territories, the same duties of Customs that are by them payable on such goods, wares, or merchandise when imported from the United States in British vessels, and no other or higher duties of Customs; and it is hereby further ordered, that on the exportation of any goods, wares, or merchandise, the growth, production, or manufacture of His Majesty's territories in Europe from this kingdom to the territories of the United States, in vessels of the said States, there shall be paid the same duties as are by law payable on such goods, wares, or merchandise when exported to the said States in British vessels, and none other or higher duties; and it is hereby further ordered, that, on the exportation from this kingdom to the United States, of any goods, wares, or merchandise, of the growth, production, or manufacture of His Majesty's territories in Europe, in vessels of the said States, there shall be paid and allowed the same bounties as are paid and allowed on such goods, wares, and merchandise when exported to the said States in British vessels: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly. *Chetwynd.*

FIVE HUNDRED GUINEAS REWARD.

Whitehall, October 23, 1815.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that, about midnight of the 18th of this month, the brig Renown, George Moore Clough, owner, being moored at the gates of Messrs. Laing's dock, in South Shields, was discovered to

be on fire, and was very materially damaged; and whereas there is strong ground for suspecting that the said fire was wilfully and maliciously occasioned by some person or persons unknown;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felony abovementioned, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person or persons who actually set fire to the vessel abovementioned) who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

SIDMOUTH.

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of FIVE HUNDRED GUINEAS is hereby offered to any person or persons (except as before excepted) who shall discover his, her, or their accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof; or to any person or persons who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, the persons guilty of the said felony, so that they may be duly convicted thereof.

The above reward of five hundred guineas to be paid by the General Committee of the Shipping Interest of the Port of Tyne.

Whitehall, October 19, 1815.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that a considerable number of persons at Shields, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, Sunderland, and in the neighbourhood of those places, have unlawfully assembled themselves together in a disorderly and tumultuous manner, for the purpose of compelling the ship-owners, and others concerned in the trade of the above mentioned ports, to comply with certain regulations prescribed by them with respect to the navigating ships and vessels proceeding to and from those ports; and have actually detained and prevented divers ships and vessels from sailing from the said ports, and have proceeded to other acts of violence; and whereas it has been further represented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that these misguided persons have formed themselves into committees, and have administered illegal oaths, with a view to the purposes before mentioned; and have also, upon various occasions, used force or intimidation to compel persons to join such unlawful assemblies, and to prevent their engaging with the said ship-owners;

His Royal Highness, being duly sensible of the mischievous consequences which must inevitably arise from such illegal and dangerous proceedings, if not speedily suppressed, and deeming it indispensably necessary to have recourse to the most effectual measures, with a view of bringing to justice the persons concerned therein, has already caused an adequate military and naval force to be assembled and stationed in those parts where the disturbances have prevailed, for the purpose of assisting the civil power (if necessary), in sup-

pressing the same, and is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His most gracious pardon to any person or persons who have been concerned in the illegal proceedings before mentioned, (except the president, or person acting as president, in any such committee, or any person having actually administered any such unlawful oath, or having used any actual force or intimidation for any of the above mentioned purposes) who shall come forward and give information against any of the persons who have administered the said oaths, or assisted in the administering the same, or have acted in a committee of any such unlawful assembly as aforesaid, or who shall have used force or intimidation to compel persons to join those unlawful assemblies, or who shall have prevented any persons from engaging themselves in the service of any of the ship-owners before mentioned;

And, as a further encouragement, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is hereby pleased to promise to any person or persons (except as aforesaid) who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, the authors, abettors, or perpetrators of any of the illegal proceedings before mentioned, so that they or any of them may be duly convicted thereof, the sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for each and every person so convicted; the said sum to be paid by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury.

Whereas it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that some evil disposed person or persons did on the evening of Thursday the 21st ultimo, between the hours of seven and eight, set fire to various ricks of corn, the property of Mr. John Hole, of Saunton-Court, within the parish of Braunton, in the county of Devon, which totally destroyed the same;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the said felony, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually set fire to the said corn ricks), who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further encouragement, the following rewards are hereby offered, viz. ONE HUNDRED POUNDS by the West of England Fire and Life Insurance Company, the sum of FIFTY POUNDS by J. Cleveland, Esq. Lord of the Manor of Saunton, and a further sum of FIFTY POUNDS by the said Mr. John Hole, and TEN POUNDS by the Braunton Association, to any person (except as is before excepted) who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof, or to any person or persons who shall apprehend and bring the

said offenders, or any of them, to conviction, or cause them, or any of them, so to be apprehended and convicted as aforesaid

Whitehall, September 22, 1815.

WHereas it hath been humbly represented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that about three o'clock of the afternoon of Tuesday the 8th August, a smuggling boat, with thirteen men, full of goods, and armed, run on board the eight-oared boat belonging to the Fox cutter, in the service of the Revenue of Excise on the coast of Kent; and that the crew of the smugglers shot four of the boatmen, and, in the most brutal manner, threw them overboard, and beat, bruised, and wounded the other boatmen, and left them for dead on the wreck of their boat;

His Royal Highness, in order to bring these atrocious offenders to justice, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person having the command or direction of the said smuggling boat), who shall discover his or their accomplices, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted.

And the Commissioners of Excise do hereby offer a reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS to any person making such discovery of any of the offenders as aforesaid, which will be paid by their Secretary upon conviction, together with a further sum of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, which they likewise hereby offer in the name and by direction of the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury.
