A PROCLAMATION,

GEORGE, P. R.

WE HEREBY the Parliament shall be further
prorogued on the said seventeenth day of January
next, We, in the name and on the behalf of His
Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Ma-
jesty's Privy Council, do hereby publish and de-
clare, that the said Parliament shall, on the first
day of February next, be held and sit for the dis-
patch of divers urgent and important affairs: And
the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights,
Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners
for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons,
are hereby required and commanded to give their
attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the
said first day of February next.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, the twenty-
seventh day of November one thousand eight

hundred and fifteen, in the fifty-sixth year of
His Majesty's reign.

GOD save the KING

BY APPOINTMENT, Secy. to His Majesty's House of Commons

That day His Royal Highness the Prince Re-
gent was pleased, in the name and on the behalf
of His Majesty, to invest Rear-Admirals Sir Thomas
Byam Martin and Sir Josias Rowley, both with
the ensigns of a Knight Commander of the Most
Honourable Military Order of the Bath, which
Byam Martin was conducted, with the usual re-
verences, to His Royal Highness, preceded by Sir
George Naylor (the Officer of Arms attendant upon
the Knight Commanders); being, upon a crimson
velvet cushion, the star, ribband, and badge of the
second class of the Order.

The sword of state was thereupon delivered to
the Prince Regent, and Sir Thomas Byam Martin,
kneeling, was knighted thereupon, after which he
had the honour to kiss His Royal Highness's hand.

Then Field-Marshal His Royal Highness the
Duke of York, First and Principal Knight Grand
Cross of the Order, having received from the Offi-
cer of Arms the ribband and badge of a Knight
Commander, presented them to the Prince Regent,
who was pleased to invest Sir Thomas Byam Mar-
tin with the same. The Rear-Admiral having again
had the honour to kiss the Prince Regent's hand,
and having received from His Royal Highness the
star of a Knight Commander, retired.

Rear-Admiral Sir Josias Rowley was then intro-
duced, knighted, and invested, with the same
ceremonies.

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration, together with the relative documents, be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

His Majesty, to grant unto Sir Samuel Ford Whittingham, Knight, Colonel in the Army, and Aide-de-Camp to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, and Lieutenant-General of the Spanish Army, and Knight of the Royal Spanish Military Order of San Fernando, His Majesty's royal licence and permission, that he may accept and wear the Grand Cross of the aforesaid Royal Spanish Military Order of San Fernando, with which His Majesty Ferdinand the Seventh, King of Spain, hath been pleased to honour him, as a signal testimony of His Catholic Majesty's approbation of the distinguished services rendered by that Officer in the field of battle during the Peninsular war.

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered, together with the relative documents, in His Majesty's College of Arms.

THE Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed us by for the payment of half-pay to Sea Officers from the 30th June to the 30th September

1815, according to His Majesty's establishment in that behalf, they are to give notice, that the general payment will only be made at the Pay Office, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at Deal or Dover, on the morning of the following days, viz:

On Wednesday the 29th and Thursday the 30th instant, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

On Friday the 1st and Monday the 4th of December, to Lieutenants and their Attornies.

On Tuesday the 5th and Wednesday the 6th, to Masters, Pursers, and Surgeons, and their Attornies.

After which the list will be recalled the first and third Wednesday in every month, that all persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and not only bring with them the affidavit required, but also their not having enjoyed the benefit of any public employment, either at sea or on shore, during the time they are to be paid their half-pay, but also to produce certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths of Allegiance required by Act of Parliament, to His Majesty, and in case any of the said Officers shall not be able to attend themselves, that employ Attornies for that purpose, that the said Attornies do, and produce the same, with affidavits from the persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are absent on leave, their Attornies are to produce attested copies of such leave, before the half-pay can be paid.

And as by Act of Parliament passed in the thirty-fifth year of His Majesty's said Majesty, entitled, "An Act for settling the arrears and expeditious Method of the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the twentieth clause of the said Act, that if any Commissioned or Warranted Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive the same at or near the place of his residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at London, to have such Half-Pay paid at or near the place of his residence, &c. in the manner pointed out by the said Act; notice is hereby further given, that the Half-Pay ending the 30th of September, will continue to be paid on the 29th instant; and all persons desirous of having their half-pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.
