A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, P. R.

WHEREAS the Parliament stands prorogued to Wednesday the seventeenth day of January next, We, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said seventeenth day of January to Thursday the first day of February next; and We have given order to the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do further hereby, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice aforesaid, publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall, on the first day of February next, be held and sit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said first day of February next.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, the twenty-seventh day of November one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, in the fifty-sixth year of His Majesty's reign.
