HEREAS it has pleased Almighty God, in His great goodness, to put an end to the war in which We were engaged against France ; We, therefore, adoring the Divine goodness, and duly considering, that the great and public blessings of peace do call for public and solemn acknowledgments, have thought fit, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the ad-vice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to issue this Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding, that a General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for these His mercics, be observed throughout those parts of the United Kingdom called England and Ireland, on Thursday the eighteenth day of Ja-nuary next; and for the better and more devout solem-nization of the same, We have given directions to the Most Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England, to compose a Form of Prayer, suitable to this occasion, to be used in all churches and chapels, and other places of public worship, and to take care for the timely dispersing of the same throughout their respective that the said public Day of Thanksgiving 'be re-ligiously observed by all His Majesty's loving sub-jects, as they tender the favour of Almighty God, and upon pain of suffering such punishment as may be justly inflicted upon all such as contemp, or neglect the same.
