Where Officers are abroad on leave, their agents are to produce attested copies of such leave, before

the half-pay can be paid.

And as by Act of Parliament, passed in the thirty-fifth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers "helonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the twentieth clause of the said Act, "that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer " who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and "shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near the place of his residence, "he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's "Navy, in London, to have such Half-Pay paid at or near the place of his residence, &c. in the man-" ner pointed out by the said Act;" notice is hereby further given, that the half-pay ending the 31st December 1815, will commence paying on the 12th instant; and all persons desirous of having their half-pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.
