

Pursuant to a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in a Cause Phillips against Hibbert, the Creditors of Nathaniel Phillips, late of Gloucester-Place, Portman-Square, in the County of Middlesex, and of Slebeck-Hall, in the County of Berks, deceased (who died on or about the 28th day of September 1814), are forthwith to come in and prove their debts before Robert Steele, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Chambers in Southampton-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, or in default thereof they will be excluded the benefit of the said Decree.
