**T**HE following Address has been presented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent; which Address His Royal Highness was pleased to receive very graciously:

To His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, REGENT of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

The humble Address of the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, and Common Council of the City of Exeter.

*May it please your Royal Highness,*

WE, the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen and Common Council of the City of Exeter, in Chamber assembled, beg leave humbly to offer to your Royal Highness our sincere congratulations on the restoration of peace to Europe.

We cannot but reflect with pride and satisfaction on the part which this country has taken in the long and eventful contest, now we trust, brought to a final issue.

The events which have happened justify us in feeling, that to the persevering firmness displayed by your Royal Highness, the energy by which the Councils of this great nation have been directed, and to the ascendancy of British valour, the favourable result of this contest is mainly owing; and in contemplating the progress and completion of those negotiations, in which the interests of so many great nations have been recently discussed and settled, we feel additional pride in reflecting, that no projects of aggrandizement, no selfish or partial views, have been suffered to interfere with the great object of securing peace and tranquillity to Europe.

Although we cannot but be sensible of the great pressure under which, from a concurrence of various causes, this country at present labours, yet, upon a review of the events of the last twenty years, we find infinitely more ground of consolation than complaint; and we rely with confidence upon the prudent exertions of your Royal Highness's Government to render that pressure temporary only, and permanently to secure the solid advantages of peace.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, acting in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, was pleased, on the 4th day of December last, to confer the honour of Knighthood upon Hugh Gough, Esq. Lieutenant-Colonel of His Majesty's 87th (or Prince of Wales's Own Irish) Regiment of Foot, Companion of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, and Knight of the Royal and Distinguished Spanish Order of Charles the Third;

And being desirous of conferring upon the said Sir Hugh Gough such a further mark of His Majesty's royal favour as may, in an especial manner; evince the sense His Royal Highness entertains of the highly distinguished services of that Officer, throughout the splendid achievements of His Majesty's arms in the Peninsula, and more particularly the great ability and signal valour displayed by him in command of His Majesty's 87th regiment of foot, at the memorable battle of Talavera de la Reyna; at the siege of Cadiz; at the brilliant action fought on the heights of Barrosa (wherein the eagle of the 8th French regiment was captured in a charge by His Majesty's said 87th regiment); also at the siege of Tarifa (where, having the command of the east wall of the fortress, in which the enemy had made a practicable breach, he, with eight companies of the said regiment, amounting to five hundred men, repulsed eighteen hundred picked troops,

by which the breach was assaulted); and his conspicuous conduct at the battles of Vittoria, the Pyrenees, and the Nivelle; His Royal Highness hath been pleased to grant unto the said Sir Hugh Gough, His Majesty's royal licence and authority that, as a lasting memorial of his faithful and zealous exertions in His Majesty's service, he and his descendants may bear the following honourable augmentation to the arms of his family, viz. "In the centre chief point pendant from a ribbon a representation of the badge of the Order of Charles the Third, and on a chief within battlements, a representation of the fortress of TARIFA, with a breach between two turrets, the British flag flying on the dexter turret;" and the crest of augmentation following, that is to say, on a wreath "A dexter arm embowed, the hand grasping the colours of His Majesty's said 87th regiment, and a French eagle depressed, the staff broken;" and in an escrol below the arms this motto "TARIFA;" provided the said armorial distinctions be first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise His Majesty's said licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command, that the said royal concession and especial mark of His Majesty's favour be registered in the College of Arms.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent hath been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto Philip Keating Roche, Esq. Lieutenant-Colonel in the British Army, and Lieutenant-General in the Spanish Service, His royal licence and authority, that he may accept and wear the supernumerary cross of the Royal and Distinguished Order of Charles the Third, and the Order of Saint Ferdinand of the third class, with which His Catholic Majesty has been pleased to honour him, in testimony of that Sovereign's approbation of the distinguished military services rendered by him, in the field, during the Peninsular war; and that he may enjoy all the rights and privileges thereunto annexed; provided nevertheless, that His Majesty's said licence and permission, doth not authorise, and shall not be deemed or construed to authorise, the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence, or privilege appertaining unto a Knight Bachelor of these realms:

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.
