THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Deputy Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, for declaring His Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for exhibiting a Bill in this present Parliament, for naturalizing His Serene Highness Leopold George Frederick Duke of Saxe, Margrave of Meissen, Landgrave of Thuringuen, Prince of Cobourg of Saalfeld.

An Act to amend an Act, of the fifty-first year of His present Majesty, for confirming certain articles of agreement between the Company of Proprietors of the Grand Junction Canal and certain persons, for supplying with water the inhabitants of the parish of Paddington, and the parishes and streets adjacent, in the county of Middlesex.

An Act for the better assessing and collecting the poor and other parochial rates in the parish of Mitcham, in the county of Surrey.

An Act for making and maintaining a road from Dewsbury to Leeds, in the west riding of the county of York.
