THE Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy do hereby give notice, that on Thursday the 4th of April next, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying His Majesty's several Dock-Yards, or any one or more of them, and also this Office, with

No tender will be received after one o'clock on the day of treaty, nor any noticed, unless the party, or an agent for him, attends.

Every tender must be accompanied by a letter, addressed to the Navy Board, and signed by two responsible persons, engaging to become bound with the person tendering, in the sum of £25 per 100 chaldrons of coals, for the due performance of the contract.
