An Act for making and maintaining a turnpike rond from the High-Street, in the town of Stour-bridge in the county of Worcester to the boun-dary stone, between the parish of Warfield and the liberties of the borough of Bridgnorth, in the county of Salop.

An Act for more effectually repairing and improving the road from Stockport, in the county of Chester, to the end of Guide-Lane, in the county of Lancaster, and other roads therein mentioned in the said counties and in the county of York, and for making a new road from the said road in Bredbury to the bridge over the River Mersey, at Portwood, near the town of Stockport.

An Act for more effectually repairing the road Mon the twentieth mile stone on Egham-Hill, in the county of Surrey, to a place called Basing-istone, trear the town of Bagshot, in the parish of Windlesham, in the same county.

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

HEREAS the time limited by the Order of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council of the twentieth day of July last, for prohibiting the exportation out of this kingdom, or carrying coastwise, gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, will expire on the thirteenth day of this instant February; and whereas it is judged expedient, that the said prohibition, so far as applies to the countries hereinafter named, should be continued for some time longer; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's service) do, at any time during the space of six months (to com-mence from the said thirteenth day of February instant), presume to transport any gunpowder or asalt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa, or in the West Indies, or on any part of the Continent of America (except to a port or place, or ports or places, in His Majesty's territories or possessions on the Continent of North America, or in the territories of the United States of America), or ship or lade any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa, or in advice of His or Their Privy Council, many lave

Basingstoke, and from thence to Alton, in the county of Southampton.

An Act for making and maintaining a turnpike road from the township of Nantwich to Wheelock Wharf, in the township of Sandback, in the county palatine of Chester.

The West Indies of the Continent of America (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that belant first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty pinth year of His late Majesty's reign intwenty-ninth year of His late Majesty's reign, in-tituled "An Act to empower His iMajesty to "probabit the exportation of salf-patre, and to "enforce the law for empowering His Majesty "to prohibit the exportation of gunpowder, or any sort of arms or animunition, and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying coastwice of salt-petre; gunpowder, or any sort of arms or ammunition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the exportation of naval "stores, and imore effectually to prevent the ex-portation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, "portation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, "when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in "Council: But it is His Royal Highness's pleasure, that nothing in this Order contained shall be construed to after or repeal the Order in Council of the twentieth of May one thousand eight bundred and thirteen, for regulating the export of gunpowder and arms to the coast of Africa, under the conditions therein specified. And the Right Honouvalle the Lords Commissioners of this Majesty's Treasury the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord Third Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Ma-Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the forty-fifth year of His Majesty's reign, intitated An Act for making further provisions for the " effectual performance of quarantine," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council, or any three or more of them, to make such Order as they shall see necessary and expedient upon any unforeseen emorgency, or in any particular case or cases with respect to any ship or ships, vessel or wessels and having any infectious declared or distemper on board, or on board of which any infectious disease or distemper may have appeared in the course of the voyage, or arriving under any other alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection, although such ship or ships, vessel or yessels, shall not have come from any place or places from which His Majesty, His heirs or successors! by and with the
