At the General Quarter Session of the Peace of our Lord the King, holden for the City of London, at the Guildhall, within the said City, on Monday the 1st day of April, in the Fifty-sixth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King, Defender of the Faith, before Matthew Wood, Esq. Mayor of the City of London, Sir Richard Carr Glyn, Baronet, Sir William Leighton, Knight, Sir Charles Flower, Baronet, Sir Claudius Stephen Hunter, Baronet, Aldermen of the said City, Sir John Silvester, Baronet, Recorder of the said City, John Atkins, Esq. William Heygate, Esq. other of the Aldermen of the said City, and others their Fellows, Justices of our said Lord the King, assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lord the King within the said City; and also to hear and determine divers Felonies, Trespasses, and other Misdeeds committed within the said City;
