His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, taking into His royal consideration the meritorious services performed by James Campbell, Esq. Colonel in the Army, and Lieutenant-Colonel of the 94th Regiment of Foot, Companion of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, and Knight of the Royal Portuguese Military Order of the Tower and Sword, in command of his regiment throughout the Mahratta War, from 1803 to 1806, more especially at the battle of Argaum, in November 1803; at the assault and capture of the fort of Gawil Ghur, in the same year; at the siege of Chandore, in November 1804; as also the great zeal, energy, and valour manifested by him throughout the arduous operations of His Majesty's arms in the Peninsula, and particularly at the battle of Fuentes d'Onor, on the 5th May 1811, in command of a brigade of the third division of the army, which he led to victory; at the capture of Ciudad Rodrigo, on the 19th January 1812, upon which memorable occasion he headed his own regiment, and stormed the great breach; at the assault and capture of Badajoz, on the night of the 6th of April following, when the command of the third division, by which the castle of that fortress was carried by escalade, devolved upon him; and also at the ever-memorable battles of Salamanca
