## From Cotutaday April 20, to Monday April 24, 1682:

Argiers ${ }^{2}$ Feh. $\ddagger$.

TH E rach Inflant, Admirak Ferbert came before thus Place with Six tirigats; and the next day a Saitea belo ging to this Place, was taken by Captain Sbouel. ThisGoverament has now abroad 4 nien of War, and 3 Saireas: The pzth was brbughe in here the Martba and Mary of London, David Battin Malter, Ladnn with Oyls from Faro. Cologne, April 24. On Tuelday latt arrimed hate Prince Egan of Eurflemberg from Franç, and atbe next dity fad Audience of our Elector. The soa Men which bis Electoral Highnefs is to furnifh in purfuance of his Treaty with thefe Magiftrates, will enter the place the 28 th Ioftant; and tha Troops which the States of the Citcle of wefliphalia have refolved to rend to our afiffance, are ready to March in 24 Hours; they confilt, as is faid, in three Regiments of Eoot, and two pf Horfe, of which, 1000 Men in cafe of actual Service, are to bs maintained at the Charge of the City, and the relt at that of the faid Circle. The Prince of Parma continues fitl here. The French Envoy, Monfeur Tambonntau, has not hitherto made any ilrogrels, that we hear of, in bis Negotiation at the Court of the Elector of Trier.

Hagwe, April 24, The Prince and Princels of Orange are gene for Dieren, where they will pars fome time. Count Waldeck, who was fomi time fincc, chofen by the States. Alfembled af Ratisbonne, to be Goneral of the Army of the Empire, has now accepted of that Command, and Complements have thetetrpon paffed between his Highnefs the Prince of Qrange and him. Qur Northeri Letters inform us, That a Diftafive Allianoe is concluded between the King of Sweden; and the princes of Lurzenburg; that the firit has piomifed, whenever there fhall'be occafion fot it, to bring 40000 - M/en into the Field, and a good'Fleet to Sea; aud the hatter to have 20000 Men in áreadinefo, to act aṣ the flate ofrthitgs thall require.
