Cologne, April 24. On Tuesday last arrived here Prince Egon of Furlemberg from France, and the next day had Audience of our Elector. The 860 Men which his Electoral Highness is to furnish in pursuance of his Treaty with these Magistrates, will enter the place the 28th Instant; and the Troops which the States of the Circle of Westphalia have resolved to send to our assistance, are ready to March in 24 Hours; they confilt, as is faid, in three Regiments of Foot, and two of Horse, of which, 1000 Men in case of actual Service, are to be maintained at the Charge of the City, and the rest at that of the said Circle. The Prince of Parma continues still here. The French Envoy, Monsieur Tambonneau, has not hitherto made any Progress, that we hear of, in his Negotiation at the Court of the Elector of Trier.

Hague, April 24. The Prince and Princess of Orange are gone for Diesen, where they will pass some time. Count Waldeck, who was some time fines, chosen by the States Assembled at Ratisbonne, to be General of the Army of the Empire, has now accepted of that Command, and Complements have thereppon passed between his Highness the Prince of Orange and him. Our Northern Letters informus, That a Defenive Alliance is concluded between the King of Sweden; and the Princes of Lunenburg; that the first has promised, whenever there shall be occasion for it, to bring 40000 Men into the Field, and a good Fleet to Sea; and the larter to have 20000 Men in a readincie, to act as the
