Argiers, Feb. 16.

THE 14th Instant, Admirak Herbert came before this Place with Six Frigates; and the next day a Saitea belonging to this Place, was taken by Captain Shouel. This Government has now abroad 4 Men of War, and 3 Saiteas. The 12th was brought in here the *Martha* and *Mary* of London, David Bastin Master, Laden with Oyls from Faro.

Cologne, April 24. On Tuesday last arrived here Prince Egon of Eurslemberg from France, and the next day had Audience of our Elector. The 800 Men which his Electoral Highness is to furnish in pursuance of his Treaty with these Magistrats, will enter the place the 28th Instant; and the Troops which the States of the Circle of *Westphalia* have resolved to send to our assistance, are ready to March in 24 Hours; they consist, as is said, in three Regiments of Foot, and two of Horse, of which, 1000 Men in case of actual Service, are to be maintained at the Charge of the City, and the rest at that of the said Circle. The Prince of *Payma* continues still here. The French Envoy, Monsieur *Tambonneau*, has not hitherto made any Progress, that we hear of, in his Negotiation at the Court of the Elector of *Trier*.

Hague, April 24. The Prince and Princess of *Orange* are gone for *Dieren*, where they will pass some time. Count *Waldeck*, who was some time since, chosen by the States Assembled at *Ratisbonne*, to be General of the Army of the Empire, has now accepted of that Command, and Complements have thereupon passed between his Highness the Prince of *Orange* and him. Our Northern Letters inform us, That a Defensive Alliance is concluded between the King of *Sweden*, and the Princes of *Luxemburg*; that the first has promised, whenever there shall be occasion for it, to bring 40000 Men into the Field, and a good Fleet to Sea; and the latter to have 20000 Men in readiness, to act as the state of things shall require.

Marseilles, April 21. This day arrived here a Bark in 15 days from *Alicant*, the Master whereof tells us, that Admiral *Herbert* was there some days before he came away; and that he was again gone over for *Argiers*. Monsieur *Chusleau* says, had been likewise at *Alicant*, with the Squadron under his Command, and was gone over for *Argiers*.

Paris, April 25. We are told that a Treaty is concluded between this Crown and the King of *Denmark*, by which the latter obliges himself to keep 10000 Men in the Country of *Oldenburg*, and in consideration thereof, is to have presently 400 thousand Livres, and 300 thousand yearly by way of Subsidy; and in case *Denmark* be Attacked by *Sweden*, our King is to assist the King of *Denmark* with 10000 Capital Men of War. We are likewise informed that our King has made a Treaty with the *Princess Palatine*, by which his Majesty in consideration of the Lands that have been seized by the

French, gives his Electoral Highness 600000 Livres at present, and 300000 Livres Yearly. The Kings Envoy at *Trier*, is not able to do any good, that Elector adhering it seems very firmly to the Interests of the Empire. On Saturday last, the first President, accompanied with six Councillors, and the Attorney General, came into the Assembly of the University of this City, and caused the Kings Edict upon the late Declaration of the Clergy, to be there Registered; and next Saturday they will go to the *saubonne*, to have likewise Registered there.

Whitehall, April 22. His Majesty continues to receive with his accustomed Goodness, the Loyal Addresses that are presented to him from the several Counties and Corporations.

WH Your Majesties most Loyal and most Obedient Subjects, the Lord Mayor, Sheriffs, Commons, and Citizens of Your Majesties City of *Dublin*, in Common Council Assembled, being deeply sensible of the great Happiness, Peace, Security, and Tranquility that we now enjoy under Your Majesties most Gracious Government, and of Your Majesties great Favour to us in Committing the Administration thereof, under Your Majesty, into the hands of his Grace the Duke of *Ormonde*, Your Majesties Lord Lieutenant of this Kingdom, of whose prudent Conduct, and excellent Management of Affairs here, we have had long Experience; do think our selves, in all Duty, obliged to express our most humble and hearty Thankfulness for those many Blessings, under God, derived to us from Your Majesties most Just and equal Government; as also our Detestation of all those wicked Practices and Contingences that have been of late made use of by some Factions and Ill-minded Men, to alienate from Your Majesty the Affections of Your Subjects, and to seduce them from the Duty and Obedience that they owe unto Your Majesty. We therefore most humbly beg leave of Your most Sacred Majesty, hereby to Assure Your Majesty, That though others of Your Majesties Subjects may have been more early and more largely in Verbal Expressions of their Loyalty and Thankfulness to Your Majesty, yet none shall ever exceed us in any real Demonstrations thereof: And that we shall, upon all occasions, be ready with our Lives and Fortunes to defend and preserve Your Majesties Royal Person and Prerogatives, the Loyal and Lawful descent of Your Imperial Crown, the true Protestant Religion, and the Government as it is now by Law Established in Church and State, against all Conspiracies, Attempts, and Aspersions whatsoever, that may be made or entered into, by either Papists or Fanatics, or other Disturbers of the Publick Peace. And as we are fully satisfied that no Subjects did ever live under a more Just and Gracious King; it shall be ever our Endeavours to make it appear, that the King did ever govern more Faithful and Loyal Subjects than we, who shall always pray for Your Majesties Long Life and happy Reign, and the utter disappointment of all Your Majesties Enemies. In Testimony whereof we have caused the Common Seal of the said City to be hereunto affixed, in the Four and Thirtieth Year of Your Majesties Reign.
