His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to approve of Mr. Thomas Stooks as His Danish Majesty's Consul at Gibraltar.

ERRATUM in the Gazette of Tuesday the 12th of September 1815.

In the notification announcing the royal grant of honourable augmentation to the family arms of the late Major-General Robert Ross, it should have been stated that His Royal Highness the Prince Regent had been pleased to give and grant His Majesty's permission that Elizabeth Catharine Ross, the widow and relict of the said Major-General, and his descendants respectively, should thenceforward be called Ross of Bludensberg.

Whitehall, May 25, 1816.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that a great number of persons have, for some time past, unlawfully assembled themselves together in divers parts of the counties of Norfolk, Suffolk, Huntingdon, and Cambridge, and have circulated threatening letters and incendiary hand bills; held nightly meetings; and set fire to several dwelling-houses, barns, out-buildings, and stacks of corn; and have destroyed cattle, corn, threshing-machines, and other instruments of husbandry:

His Royal Highness, seeing the mischievous consequences which must inevitably ensue, as well to the peace of the kingdom as to the lives and property of His Majesty's subjects, from such illegal and dangerous proceedings, if not speedily suppressed, and being firmly resolved to cause the laws to be put in execution for the punishment of such as offend against them, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise and declare, that any person or persons who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, the authors, abettors, or perpetrators of any of the felonies or outrages above mentioned, so that they, or any of them, may be duly convicted thereof, shall be entitled to the sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for each and every person who shall be convicted of any of the aforesaid felonies.

And His Royal Highness is further pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His most gracious pardon to any person or persons concerned in the violent and illegal proceedings in question, upon making such discovery as aforesaid, except any person who shall have been a principal in the commission of any of the felonious offences above mentioned.

Grant to the Army which served under the Command of Field-Marshal His Grace the Duke of Wellington, in the Kingdoms of Portugal, Spain, and France, from the 2d May 1809 to the 10th April 1814.
