To His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, REGENT of the United Kingdom.

WE, the Mayor and Commonalty of the City of New Sarum, in Common Council assembled, beg leave to congratulate your Royal Highness on the marriage of the Princess Charlotte of Walcs, with a Prince of illustrious family.

We are grateful for the many blessings which have been derived to the empire from the auspicious Government of His Majesty, and of the Sovereigns of His Royal Line. In common with all His Majesty's faithful subjects, we feel the most cordial satisfaction in an event which promises to gratify the domestic hopes of your Royal House, and thereby afford additional security to the enjoyment of those blessings by ourselves and our posterity.
