HIS Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to approve of the company of the Royal Artillery, commanded by Brevet Major Holcroft, being permitted to bear on their appointments (in addition to any other badges or devices which may have been heretofore granted to the Royal Regiment of Artillery) the word "*Niagara*," in consideration of the gallantry and good conduct shewn by that company at the capture of Fort Niagara, on the 19th of December 1813, and during the whole of the recent campaign on the Niagara frontier.
