Edenburg, May 4.

AN Officer who is raifing Men here, to recruit the Scotch Regiment in Holland, having Lifted a Soldier, and given him Moneys to buy himfelf neceffaries, fent him with a Guard to the relt of his Soldiers at Leith; but the Fellow as he went aloug, cricd out, That they were forcing him away: Upon which, fome of the ordinary fort got together, and refcued him. But the Magifrates having notice thereof, caufed eight of the principal that made the Refcue, to be fecured, and proceeded againft for a Riot; of which they were found Guilty, and Fined, and pat in Prifon till they fhould pay their Fine. This coming to the Ears of the Apprentices, (he that had Liffed himelf, being likewife an Apprentice) a great number of them got together on Tuefday, about Eleven 2t Nighe, forced the City-Guards, feized their Arms, poldeft themelves of the Ports of the City, and demanded the Prifoners, which the Magiftrates thought fit at that time to releafe ; but the next Merning they caufed 15 of the chief Promoters of this Difturbance, to be apprehended, and put into the Toll-booth; and the Council being met, iffued a Proclamation, to prevent any new Diforder, and commanded the Prifoners to bedelivered to threc Companies of the Earl of Mrarrs Regiment, and te be carried to the Cannomgate Tollbooth.

At three a Clock the Prifoners wereaccordingIf delivered to the faid Companies, who coming down the Street with them, were fet upon by the Rabble, that would have refcued them, and for that purpore affaulted the Soldiers with Stoues, GlafsBottles, and fuch like fuff, and had clofed the Gate through which they were to pafs: The Soldiers at firft Fired only with Powder, to fright them; but fecing that did no good, and that the Rabble preft the harder upon them, they were at laft forced to Fire in earneft, and killed feven perfons, and wounded reveral others, four of thofe that were killed being Women, for the greateft part of the Rabble were of that Sex, who thereupon dif̂erfed and rutu away, and the Soidiers carried away their Prifoners, who will be Punifhed according to their Demerit. Four Companies of the Trained Bands were in Arms, but there wasnoneed of their Affiltance, and all is now perfecty quiet again, asif there had not been the leaft diforder.
Dublix, May 2. Information having been given to ouv Lord Deputy, the Earl of Arran, that the Apprentices of this City intended to rife in great numbers, on May-day, to deftroy the French Proacflants that had taken helter here, bis Lordfhip fent to acquaint the Lord Mayor therevxith'; upon which, he Iffued bis Orders to the Conftables of every Ward to be very careful upon their' Watches, as allo to the Tradefinen, to keep their Apprensices at home; and at the lame time the Lord Der puty'being alio by aCommifion of an antienter Date

Governor of thisCity) gave fuch Orders ashe thought. fit on the Military part: But notwithftanding all the Caution ufed, about tiftee hundred Apprentices of the out-Liberties got together in a Body. yefterday Morning, abouta quarter of a Mile from the Town; My Lord Mayor went out to them with his Conflables and Civil Authority, affifted with 2 Squadron of the Kings Guards; but his Lordhip not prevailing with them to Separate, the Horle foll upon them, and forced them to difperfe, and without killing any, took 10 or 12 , who are now in my Lord Mayors hands, to be Proceeded againft faccording to Law.

Eague, May 15. Yefterday the Prince of Orange, and the Marquifs de Grana, had an Interview at a fimall place between Antwerp and Breda, his Excellency parting frum Axtwerp yefterday Morning early, as our Letters from thence tell us, for that purpolf. The Elector of $T$ rier has abfolutely rejected the Propofals made to hin by the Erench Envoy, the Sicur Tambonnean; and at the fame time calls upon this State to fatisfie him for the Arrears of Subfidies which remain due to him, that he maf. be able to provide the City of Coblents, and the Fortrefs of Erenbetffein, with all things neceflary for their Defence ; and the States General have accordingiy very earnefly recommended it to the Provinces, who have not yet paid the faid Arrears, todo it forthwith.

Paris, May 16. We are expecting, with much earnefnnefs, what the late-Mectings of the Clergy will produce: It is certain, they have feveral matters of the greated Importance before them, that feem to tend to the making the Galican Cburch dio, ftinet and independent of that of Rome, which the Pope appears very fenfibleof, and is much troubled at. Moncys have been diftributed to the Officers that are employed in the new Levies of Horfe, in which a great difinction is made betweent the Old and. New Officers, the firf having confiderably more allowed them than the other. Erom alkrefilles we have an account, that the Chetalier de Lery, failed from Thoulon the 4th Infant, with three of the Kitifs Ships for Argiers ; and at Breff five other) Frigats are fitting our, which will part from thence very fpecdily, and are. to joyn tha taid Chevalifp de Lery.
