A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, P. R.

WHEREAS the Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the second day of January next, We, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare; that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said second day of January to Tuesday the twenty-eighth day of the said month; and We have given order to the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do further hereby, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice aforesaid, publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall, on the twenty-eighth day of January next, be held and sit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And

the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said twenty-eighth day of January next.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, in the fifty-seventh year of His Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS it hath been represented to this Board, that the plague, which made its appearance and prevailed at Noya, has ceased; it is thereupon ordered, that the Order of Council of the fourteenth of February last, subjecting all ships and vessels liable to quarantine, and coming from or through the Mediterranean within the Streights of Gibraltar (although furnished with clean bills of health), to be treated as vessels arriving with suspected bills, be, and the same is, hereby revoked: and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the time being of the isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that, about half past seven o'clock in the evening of Tuesday the 10th instant, as Mr. Charles Tadman, of Higham, in the county of Kent, was returning home from Rochester corn market, he was stopped by four persons, about one mile from Strood on the London road, two of whom immediately fired pistols at him, the ball of the first went through the side of his hat, and the ball of the second into the pommel of the saddle; and whereas it hath been further represented unto His Royal Highness, that an anonymous threatening letter, addressed to the said Mr. Charles Tadman, was put into the Rochester Post-Office on Tuesday the 17th instant, evidently written by one of the parties concerned in the atrocious attack above mentioned;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in stopping and attacking the said Mr. Charles Tadman, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person or persons who actually fired the pistols), who shall discover his or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of FIFTY POUNDS is hereby offered to any person (except as is before excepted), who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof, or to any person or persons who shall apprehend and bring the said offenders to conviction, or cause them, or any of them, so to be apprehended and convicted as aforesaid.

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that about nine o'clock on the evening of Saturday the 30th November last, a body of men armed with guns, to the number of twelve and upwards, disguised by handkerchiefs, tied down by the side of their faces, attacked and entered with violence into the house of Charles John Clavering, of Littlehamhope, in the parish of Hexham, in the county of Northumberland, Esq. and after behaving in a threatening and outrageous manner, to the imminent peril of the lives of Mrs. Clavering, and other individuals of the family, demanded of the servant

a gun, which had been recently taken from a poacher by Mr. Clavering's game-keeper; and further, that the body of armed men committed a violent assault upon the person of Lieutenant Edward Johnson, who was an inmate in the house of Mr. Clavering aforesaid, and feloniously took from the said Lieutenant Johnson, a gun with which he was armed for the purpose of defending Mrs. Clavering from the attacks of the armed men before-mentioned;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the atrocious act above-mentioned, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon, to any one of them, who shall discover his or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And as a further encouragement, a reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered by the said Charles John Clavering, Esq. to any person or persons who shall discover his or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof, or to any person or persons who shall apprehend and bring the offender or offenders to conviction, or cause him or them to be apprehended and convicted as aforesaid.

The above named James Watson is a surgeon by profession, and has been employed in that capacity on board a Greenland Ship: he is a young man, apparently about twenty-three or twenty-four years of age, but is only twenty; dark hair, rather pale complexion, five feet five inches high, rather slender made, has a scar or mole under his right eye; had on a brown great coat, blue under coat, black waistcoat, drab breeches and long gaiters; appearance, shabby genteel: he has lately lodged in Hyde-Street, Bloomsbury, and was in the habit of wearing a black coat buttoned, kerseymere breeches and long gaiters.

And whereas it hath also been humbly represented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that early on Sunday morning, the 1st day of this

instant December, certain grist mills, situate near the Bridge in the Town of Chippenham aforesaid, being the mills referred to in the before mentioned threatening anonymous letter, the property of Thomas Edridge, Esq., and occupied by Messrs. Gaby and Dowling, were maliciously destroyed by fire, together with a very large quantity of flour, wheat and other property, then being therein;

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, acting in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in sending the said threatening letter, or in setting fire to the said mills, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them, (except the person who actually wrote the said letter, or actually set fire to the said mills), who shall discover his, her or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
