A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, P. R.

WHEREAS the Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the second day of January next, We, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said second day of January to Tuesday the twenty-eighth day of the said month; and We have given order to the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do further hereby, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice aforesaid, publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall, on the twenty-eighth day of January next, be held and sit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And

the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said twenty-eighth day of January next.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, in the fifty-seventh year of His Majesty's reign.

Gaby and Dowling, were maliciously destroyed by fire, together with a very large quantity of flour, wheat and other property, then being therein;
