And whether in such case it would not be highly expedient and economical, to remove the Military Seminary from Addiscombe to the more commodious and spacious buildings at Haileybury? And that the Court of Directors be further requested to report their opinions on the different points herein referred to them as soon as convenient, and call an early and special General Court to receive and consider the same.
