A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, P. R.

HEREAS on the twenty-eighth day of this instant month of January divers persons, riotously assembled and stationed in different places in the City of Westminster, proceeded to commit certain daring and highly criminal outrages, in gross violation of the public peace, to the actual danger of Our Royal Person, and to the interruption of Our passage to and from the Parliament; we therefore, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, in pursuance of an address from the two Houses of Parliament, do hereby enjoin all Magistrates, and all other His Majesty's loving subjects, to use their utmost endeavours to discover and cause to be apprehended the authors, actors, and abettors concerned in such outrages, in order that they may be dealt with according to law : And We do hereby promise, that any person

doing any act by which Our Royal Person was immediately endangered, who shall give information, so as that any of the authors, actors, or abettors concerned in such outrages as aforesaid, may be apprehended and brought to justice, shall receive a reward of

ONE THOUSAND POUNDS,

to be paid on conviction of every such offender; which said sum of one thousand pounds the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are hereby required and directed to pay accordingly: And We do further promise, that any person or persons concerned in such outrages as aforesaid, other than such as were actually concerned in any act by which Our Royal Person was immediately endangered, who shall give information, so as that any of such authors, actors, or abettors as aforesaid, shall be apprehended and brought to justice, shall, upon conviction of such offender or offenders, receive His Majesty's most gracious pardon.

HEREAS by Our Proclamation, bearing We thought fit, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, in pursuance of an Act passed in the fifty-sixth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to provide for a new silver coinage, and to regulate the currency of the gold and silver coin of this realm," to name and appoint the third day of February now next appoint as the day from and after which and from ensuing, as the day from and after which, and from thence until the seventeenth day of February then next ensuing, as the period of time during which it should and might be lawful for any person or persons to deliver into His Majesty's Mint any old silver coin, heretofore coined and current, which should by any officer or officers of the said Mint, to be appointed for that purpose by the Master of the Mint, be judged and deemed to be such silver coin of this realm; and the said third day of February now next ensuing as the day from and after which, and from thence until the seventeenth day of February then next ensuing, as the period of time during which there should be delivered out of the said Mint, new silver coins, as in the said Act is mentioned, pursuant to the regulations and disections thereof: And whereas We have thought

or persons, other than those actually concerned in fit, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to postpone the commencement of the period of time during which it shall and may be lawful for any person or persons to deliver into His Majesty's said Mint any such old silver coin, and during which there shall be delivered out of the said Mint new silver coins of equal amount according to the respective denominations of the said silver: We do hereby, in the name and on the behalf of His Majetsy, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, revoke and discharge Our said Proclamation of the eighteenth of this instant January; and We do by this Proclamation, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, name and appoint the thirteenth day of February now next ensuing, as the day from and after which, and from thence until the twenty-seventh day of February then next ensuing, as the period of time during which it shall and may be lawful for any person or persons to deliver into His Majesty's said Mint any such old silver coin, and the said thirteenth day of February now next ensuing, as the day from and after which, and from thence until the twenty-seventh day of February then next ensuing, as the period of time during which there shall be delivered out of the said Mint new silver coins, as in the said Act is mentioned, pursuant to the regulations and directions thereof.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the twenty-Weighth year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the "trade between the subjects of His Majesty's " colonies and plantations in North America and in the West India Islands and the countries belonging to the United States of America, and " between His Majesty's said subjects and the "Foreign Islands in the West Indies," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall and nay be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from time to time, to authorise, or by Warrant or Warrants under His sign manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland for the time being, to authorise, in case of necessity, the importation into Newfoundland of bread, flour, Indian coru, and live stock, from any of the territories belonging to the said United States, for the supply of the inhabitants and fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then cusuing season only; provided always, that such bread, flour, Indian corn, and live stock, so authorised to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported except in conformity to such rules, regulations, and restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants respectively, and except by British subjects, and in British-built ships, owned by His Majesty's subjects, and navigated according to law:

And whereas it is expedient and necessary, that provision be made for fully supplying the inhabitahts and fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing season, with bread, flour, Indian corn, and live stock, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent doth thereupon, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that for the supply of the inhabitants and fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing season only, bread, flour, Indian corn, and live stock, may be imported into the said island from any of the territories belonging to the said United States, by British subjects, and in British-built ships, owned by His Majesty's subjects, and navigated according to law, and which within the space of nine months previous to the time of such importation, have cleared out from some port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain or Ireland, or other His Majesty's dominions in Europe, for which purpose a licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other person or persons who may be duly authorised in that kingdom respectively, in the manner and form herein-after mentioned; which licence shall continue and be in force for nine calendar months from the day of the date upon which such licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no such licence as aforesaid, granted after the thirtieth day of September next, shall be of any force or effect: and His Royal Highness is hereby further pleased to order, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that the master or person having the charge or command of any ship or vessel to whom such licence shall be granted, shall, upon the arrival of the said ship or vessel at the port, harbour, or place in the said Island of Newfoundland where he shall discharge such bread, flour, Indian corn, and live stock, deliver up the said licence to the Col-lector or other proper Officer of the Customs there, having first indorsed on the back of such licence the marks, numbers, and contents of each package of bread, flour, Indian corn, and the number of live stock, under the penalty of the forfeiture in the said Act mentioned; and the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs at Newfoundland, is hereby enjoined and required to give a certificate to the master or person having the charge or command of such ship or vessel, of his having received the said licence so indorsed as before directed, and to transmit the same to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland respectively, by whom such licence was granted. FORM OF LICENCE.

Now be it known, that the said [person's name] hath a licence to lade on board the said ship, [ship's name] at and from any port or place belonging to the United States of America, bread, flour, Indian corn, or live stock, the produce of the said United States, and no other article whatever; and to carry the said bread, flour, Indian corn, and live stock, to some port or place in the Island of Newfoundland; and on the arrival of the said ship at any port, harbour, or place of discharge in Newfoundland, the master or person having the charge or command of the said ship, is required and enjoined to deliver up the said licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of His Majesty's Customs there, and to indorse on the back thereof the marks, numbers, and contents of each package of bread, flour, Indian corn, and the number of live stock, and shall thereupon receive a certificate thereof from the said Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs.

This licence to continue in force for calandar months from the date hereof.

HEREAS the time limited by the Order of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council of the third day of August last, for prohibiting the exportation out of this kingdom, or carrying coastwise, gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, will expire on the thirteenth day of February next; and whereas it is judged expedient, that the said prohibition, so far as applies to the countries hereinafter named, should be continued for some

time longer; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's service) do, at any time during the space of six months (to com-mence from the said thirteenth day of February next), presume to transport any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa, or in the West Indies, or on any part of the Continent of America (except to a port or place, or ports or places, in His Majesty's territories or possessions on the Continent of North America, or in the territories of the United States of America), or ship or lade any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa, or in the West Indies, or on the Continent of America (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of salt-petre, and to enforce the law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of gunpowder, or any sort of arms or anumunition, and also to " empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre, gunpowder, or any sort of arms or ammunition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled "An Act to enable His" Majesty to restrain the exportation of naval " stores, and more effectually to prevent the ex-" portation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council:" But it is His Royal Highness's pleasure, that nothing in this Order contained shall be construed to alter or repeal the Order in Council of the twentieth of May one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, for regulating the export of gunpowder and arms to the coast of Africa, port of gunpowder and arms to the coast of Africa, under the conditions therein specified. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively ap-Jas. Buller. pertain.

Hereas it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that on Sunday the 1st day of December last, between five and six o'clock in the evening, some person or persons entered the dwelling-house of William Howard, of Yiewsley, in the parish of Hillingdon, in the county of Middlesex, farmer, and most barbarously and inhumanly murdered the said William Howard; and also violently beat Sarah Randall, his housekeeper, with a bludgeon, leaving her almost dead, and afterwards stole a considerable sum of money from a bureau in the said dwelling-house;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the said murder and robbery, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person or persons who actually murdered the said William Howard), who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of FIFTY POUNDS is hereby offered by the relatives of the said William Howard, and FIFTY POUNDS by the parish of Hillingdon, to any person (except as before excepted) who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof, or to any person or persons who shall apprehend and bring the said offenders, or any of them, to conviction, or cause them, or any of them, so to be apprehended and convicted as aforesaid.

Hereas it has been humbly represented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that James Watson the younger, formerly of Hyde-Street, Bloomsbury, surgeon, stands indicted for a capital felony, in having wilfully and feloniously attempted to kill and murder Richard Platt, on Monday the 2d day of December last, by firing a loaded pistol at and desperately wounding the said Richard Platt; and that the said James Watson also stands charged with having committed other high and atrocious offences;

His Royal Highness, for the better and more speedy appreliending and bringing to justice the said James Watson for the felony, and offences aforesaid, is hereby pleased, acting in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, to promise to any person or persons who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, the said James Watson, the sum of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS; to be paid by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, upon the said James Watson being apprehended and lodged in any one of His Majesty's gaols.

The above named James Watson is a surgeon by profession, and has been employed in that capacity on board a Greenland ship: he is a young man, apparently about twenty-three or twenty-four years of age, but is only twenty; dark hair, rather pale complexion, five feet five inches high, rather slender made, has a scar or mole under his right eye, and a slight scarification on the cyclid, which disfigures the eye, and faint renains of small pox in his face; had on a brown great coat, blue under coat, black waistcoat, drab breeches; and long gaiters; appearance; shabby genteel: he formerly lodged in Hyde-Street, Bloomsbury, and was in the habit of wearing a black coat buttoned, kerseymere breeches, and long gaiters.

Where Officers are abroad on leave, their agents are to produce attested copies of such leave, before the half-pay can be gaid.

And, as by, Act of, Parliament, passed in the thirty-fifth year of His present Mujesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for establishing a more easy and " expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the twentieth clause of the said Act, "that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near the place of his residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, in London, to have such Half-Pay paid "at or near the place of his residence, &c, in the man-ner pointed out by the said Act;" and by a further Act, passed in the fifty-sixth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled. "An Act for "enabling the Officers in His Majesty's Navy, and their representatives, to draw fer and re-"ceive their half-pay," it is enacted by the first and third clauses of the said Act, "that if any Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be eu-" titled to receive any sum of money for or on ac-" count of his half-pay, shall be desirous of draw-"ing a bill of exchange for the same upon the "Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill, he shall signify such desire, by letter, to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy; and that if any "Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be en-" titled to receive any sum of money for or on ac-"count of half-pay, shall be desirous of having his half-pay paid to him by extract at any of " His Majesty's Dock-Yards where Clerks for the payment of wages for the Navy shall reside, in-" stead of receiving the same by remittance bill or "bill of exchange, he is to apply either to the proper Clerk, at the Navy Pay-Office, in London, or at the Pay-Office at such Dock-Yard, "signifying such his desire;" notice is hereby further given, that the half-pay ending the 31st December 1816, will commence paying on the 10th instant; and all persons desirous of drawing for or of having their half-pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.
