The Humble Address of Your Majesties Loyal and Dutiful Subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty of Your Majesties ancient Burrough of HELLON, in the County of Cornwall.

Most Dread Sovereign,

When we consider the unpeackable Miseries and Calamities which these Your Majesties Kingdoms have laboured under by Reason of the late impetuous Rebellion and horrid Murders of our late Sovereign, Your Majesty's Royal Father of ever blessed Memory; and of the restless Endeavours of evil Men, totally to extirpate Your Sacred Majesty and Royal Family, together with our Religion by Law Established; and of the great Progress made by these Hellish Endeavours in their compassing their damnable Design and all under a specious pretence of Pious Religion; we cannot but acknowledge it a Mercy far beyond Merit and Mankind, That it hath pleased Almighty God to send Your Majesty to the Employment of Your Majesty the Protector of the Religion, and as Your Subjects to the immediate Protection and Assistance of a Prince, in which apparently visible, that Almighty Providence hath been so wickedly Plots, and Conspiracies to hope that any Contrivances, had their Sovereigns, against Gods Protection; Notwithstanding the heavy and should come to meet lately seen a Paper, not long since, four great Images discovered and produced of the Pretending a most happy ment against the Earl of Shaftsbury; and then produced the Charter, which contains a most and abominable and a most, tending to Sedition and Rebellion, and an absolute destruction of Monarchy, and the good Government by Law established. We therefore think our selves obliged in duty to protest to Your Majesty our afflicted and detestable and Abhorrence of the said ASSOCIATIONS, and of all Treasonable Confederacies and Combinations whatsoever, against Your Majesties Person or Government: And we do solemnly and sincerely declare and protest, That upon all occasions we will be ready to sacrifice our Lives and Fortunes in Defence of Your Majesty, Your Lawful Heirs, and lawful Successors, and that Church and State of England, as now by Law Established; and that, whensoever Your Majesty shall in Your Princely Wisdom think fit to call a Parliament, we will make it our principal Care, as his Majesty we have done, to send such Representatives for this our Burrough, as shall endeavour to answer those ends for which Parliaments were ordained.

That Your Majesty may quash all Plots and Contrivances whatsoever, against Your Royal Person or Government, and that the Authors, Contrivers and Abettors thereof, of what Sort soever they be, may be brought to condign Punishments; That all Your Enemies may become Your Footstool; and that the Great God of Heaven, who hath hitherto so miraculously preserved Your Royal Person, may grant You a long and happy Reign over us; and that after this Life you may obtain everlasting joy and felicity; us, and shall be the daily Prayers of, Great SIR, Your Majesties most Loyal and Dutiful Subjects.
