From Eungary w $h_{2}$ we an Account, That Count Teckeley was-retuined from the Conference he had with the Baffa of ofen; and it is foid that the faid Baffa told him, That the Grand Signior could not enter into a War this Ycar, bue that he fhould have the aff. flance of the Tranfilvanians; however that the Port left it to himfelf to make Peace, or continue the War with the Emperor, as he thought fit, which-we look upon here as an Argument that the Turks do not defign a War; for if they did, they would not fuffer Count Teckeley to make his Peace.
Strasburg, May 22. Our Letters from Lorrain t:ll us, That the French are bringing an Army togedher near Nancy, which will confilt chiefly of the Troops of the Kings Houthold. We are expecting here Prince william of Farflemberg, who it's generally believed will finceed his Brother in this Bifhoprick.

Cologne, May 26. The Emperor has written to our Magiltrates, to require them to reftore the Burgermafter Krebs to his former place, which they have communicated to the Commons of this City, who feem lomewhat difurbed thereat. The Affairs of liege cannot be yet compord, by reafon of the feveral Factions in that City, who hinder the refolutions that would otherwic be taken for the putting an end to there differences between their Elector and them, which have been the occaGon of fo much Prejudice and Difturbance to that City.
Gamburg, May 26. We have Letters from Co. penkagen which tell us of the Kings departurefiom thence for Holjtein; and here is a report that there is to be an Intervievy between His Ma;efty and the Elećtor of Brandenburg to morrow, at a place call'd Jizeho. From stockbolms they write, That the King dikd halic̣ out the Squadron of Men of war he intends to have at Sea this Summer.

Hidite, May 2o. The Treaty of Commerce concluder betwepn this State and the King of Denmark, in $1+43$. for 40 years, is going to expirc: Among other the advantages the Subjects of there Countreys obtailed by it, this was cno, Tbat their Sbips paffing the sound faid ouly fo mach per Tan, according to their Burden, whatquer their Lading wow, which was not to be examined. The States would renew th's Treaty, but it's faid the King of Dernath will not, and that he pretdnds the putch

Ships Trading to thofe parts fhall for the future only carry fuch Goods as are the growth or Manits factue of there Countreys, and particularly that they thall not Laje French Wines. The Prince of Or agge returned hither the 23 inftant, and the next day he P uncelis"; the 25 th their Highneffes parted again for Honflaerdyke, with intention to pals this Seifon tucre. The 27 th the States of Holland met again, and the Prince of Orange came purpofely to Town to aflit in their Afiembly, and having fo done, returned again to Honfaerdjke.
Paris, May 30. There is fome flop pot to the Levics of Horié, and feveral Officers that were to have had Conmmiffions are fent back to the Garifons from whence they came, the King allowing them 25 Crowns for the Cbarge of their Journeys; for which feveral Reafons are given, but the moft probable feem to be, That thefe Levies of Horfe, might not hinder thofe of the Foot, which the King will have made firlt, the raifing of Horle being much the cafier of the two. The Provincial Treafurers for the Extraordinaries of the War, which are now Prifoners at Arras, are going to be Tryed, the King having fent Commiffioners thither for that purpofe. The 28 ch Inftant dyed Henry de Bourbon, Duke de Verneuil, Natural Son to Hexry the Fourth, and Governor of Languedoc, in the 81 Year of his Age. From Pravence they write, That the Cardinal de Grimaldi lay very ill $x_{r}$ wichout any hopts of his Recovery.
wivadfor, May 23. Befides the Addreffes which fol10w, there bave been otheis Prefented to His Majefty from the Juftiees of the Peace, and the Gend tlemen of the Grand Inqueft for the County of Wefmorland, at the General Quarter-Seffions of the peace holden fur the fiid County at Kendat, the 28 th of April $1 \$ 82$. as likewife from the Mayor; Recorder, Aldermen, and Burgeffes of the Corporation of Kendal; and the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, Common-Council, and other Alembers of the Burrough of Appleby, in the faid Country of Weftmorland; all which His Majefty was pleafed to receive very Gracioully.
