Vienna, May 19.

HE last Week arrived here an Envoy from the Kam of Tartary; He has had Council of War, and we cannot hear that he has any other business than to affure the Emperor of the Friendship of the Kam, and of his delire to contribute his Endeavours for the preferring the Peace between the Emperor and the Grand Signior. Some days fince a great Council of War was held at Laxemburg, where, as we are told, it was refolved, besides the Levies that Catherlogh, and Wexford, and the City of Water-are now in hand, to give out Commissions for the ford, the Town of Drogheda, and the Corporaraising 20000 Men more. Three days since, the Bishop of Estaphania was dispatched to the Court of Bavaria, but we know not upon what Errand, his Commission being kept very secret. The Count d'Althenie, the Emperors Ambassador to the King of Sweden, parted from hence yesterday. There are Letters from Hungary which fay, that the Rebels begin to mistrust the Turks, and therefore are the more enclined to make their Peace with the Em-
