His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue and extend the provisions of an Act, of the forty-minth year of His present Majesty, "for regulating the trade and commerce to and from the Cape of Good Hope, until the fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and "twenty; and also for regulating the trade of the Island of Mauritius;" His Majesty is authorised, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by any Order or Orders to be issued from time to time, to give such directions, and make such regulations touching the trade and commerce to and from all islands, colonies, or places, and the terri-tories and dependencies thereof, to His Majesty belonging or in His possession, in Africa, or Asia to the eastward of the Cape of Good Hope (excepting only the possessions of the East India Company), as to His Majesty, in Council, shall appear most expedient and salutary, any thing contained in an Act, passed in the twelfth year of the reign of His Majesty King Charles the Second, intituled "An Act for the encouraging and increas-" ing of shipping and navigation," or in an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King William the Third, intituled "An Act for preventing frauds, and regulating abuses in the plantation trade," or any other Act or Acts of Parliament now in force, relating to His Majesty's colonies and plantations, or any other Act or Acts of Parliament, law, usage or custom to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding: and whereas on the night of the twenty-fifth of September last, a dreadful fire broke out in the town of Port Lewis, in the Island of Mauritius, which totally destroyed the chief part of that town, together with a great mass of provisions and merchandise intended for the consumption and tradeof its inhabitants, whereby a great number of families were reduced to extreme indigence, and left without a home; in consequence of which dreadful calamity the Governor of the soid Island. found himself compelled to open the ports of the Island to foreign vessels, in order to afford the speediest relief of which the case would admit, and thereby to save His Majesty's subjects residing in that colony from the greatest extremity of distress; and whereas it is expedient that facilities should in consequence be granted to the trade of the Island of Mauritius, for a limited time, with the view of giving still further relief to its suffering inhabitants; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is bereby ordered, that all vessels, whether British or foreign vessels belonging to countries in amity with His Majesty, arriving at any port of the Island of Mauritius, or its dependencies, within twelve months from the date of. this present Order, from any country in amity with His Majesty, laden with any articles the growth, production, or manufacture of any such country, excenting all articles composed of cotton, iron, steel, or wool of foreign manufacture, shall be permitted to enter and land their cargoes, and dispose of the same, in the said ports; provided always, that such articles, when imported in a foreign ship, shall pay a duty of two per cent, ad valorem, over and above

And it is further ordered, that every such vessel, arriving as aforesaid, shall be permitted to export a cargo, consisting of any articles of the growth, produce, or manufacture of the Island of Mauritius, or its dependencies, or of any other articles which shall have been legally imported there; and that all such articles so exported in foreign vessels, shall in like manner be subject to a duty of two per cent. ad valorem, over and above the duties (if any). which shall be payable on similar articles when exported from the Mauritius, or its dependencies, in British vessels.

It is, however, hereby further ordered and declared, that no foreign vessel, allowed by the terms of this Order to export a cargo from the Island of Mauritius, or its dependencies, shall be permitted to export such cargo to any of His Ma-jesty's possessions. But that every British vessel which shall during the continuance of this present Order, have imported a cargo into any port of the said Island of Mauritius, or its dependencies, either from the United Kingdom, or from any other place, shall be permitted to carry back a return cargo, consisting of the articles aforesaid, to any place whatever, either belonging to His Majesty, or to any state in amity with His Majesty. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The above Ministers were respectively introduced to their audiences by Earl Bathurst, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in the absence of Lord Viscount Castlereagh, and conducted by Ceremonies.

Then, by the command of the Prince Regent, Major-General Sir George Townshend Walker was introduced into the presence between Visgount Strangford and Sir David Baird, the two Junior Knights Grand Crosses present, preceded by the Gentleman Usher of the Order.

Deputy Bath presenting, thereupon, to the Duke of York, Senior Knight Grand Cross, the ribband and badge, His Royal Highness delivered the same to the Prince Regent, and Sir George Townshend Walker (already a Knight) kneeling, His Royal Highness was pleased to invest him therewith: after which, Sir George, rising, kissed the Prince Regent's hand, and, having received from His Royal Highness the star of the Order, with-

The Knights Grand Crosses were then called over, and the procession returned in the order as before.

By command of the Prince' Regent, Sir Albemarle Bertie was conducted, with the usual reverences, to His Royal Highness, preceded by Sir George Nayler (the Officer of Arms attendant upon the Knights Commanders); bearing upon a crimson velvet cushion the star, ribband, and badge of the second class of the Order.

The sword of state was thereupon delivered to the Prince Regent, and Sir Albemarle Bertie, kneeling, was knighted therewith, after which he had the honour to kiss His Royal Highness's hand.

Then His Royal Highness the Duke of York, First and Principal Knight Grand Cross of the Order, having received from the Officer of Arms the ribband and badge of a Knight Commander, presented them to the Prince Regent, who was pleased to invest Sir Albemarle with the same. The Admiral baving again had the honour to kiss the Prince Regent's hand, and having received from His Royal Highness, the star of a Knight Commander, retired.

Lieutenant-General Sir Robert Macfarlane was then introduced, knighted, and invested, with the

same ceremonies.

THEREAS by an Act, passed in the forty-third year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled ". An Act for permitting certain goods imported into Great Britain, to be secured "in warehouse without payment of duty," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the importer or importers, proprietor or proprietors, consignee or consignees, of any of the goods, wares or merchandise enumerated or described in the table thereunto annexed marked (E), and which shall have been legally imported or brought into the port of London, to: lodge and secure in a warehouse or warehouses to be provided for that purpose, any such goods, wares, or merchandise under the joint locks of the Crown and the merchant, without payment, at the time of the first entry, of the duties of customs due on the importation thereof; and it is by the said recited Act further enacted, that if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, or any three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the provisions of the said Act should be extended to any goods, wares, and merchandise not enumerated or described in either of the tables annexed thereto, and should cause a list of such goods, wares, and merchaudise to be published in the London Gazette,

visions, regulations, and restrictions of the said Act shall extend to such goods, wares and mer-chandise, in every respect, in as full and ample a manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said tables respectively, at the time of passing the said Act:

We, the undersigned, Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to and in execution of the powers vested in us in and by the said Act, do hereby declare, that it appears to us expedient that the provisions of the said Act should
