HEREAS by the forty-third section of His Majesty's Order in Council, of the fifth of April one thousand eight hundred and five, it is ordered, that all ships and vessels arriving in the ports of Great Britain, or the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, having come from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, which with their officers, crews, passengers, and cargoes, shall have previously performed quarantine in the lazaret at Malta, Ancona, Venice, Messina, Leghorn, Genoa, or Marseilles, shall, upon their arrival, be put under quarantine in some of the ports or places hereinbefore appointed for the performance of quarantine, until the Commander, Master, or other person having the charge of such ship or vessel shall have produced to the Superintendant of Quarautine, or his Assistant, or to the Principal or other Officer of the Customs authorised to act in that behalf, the proper documents to prove that such ship or vessel, and the officers, crew, passengers, and cargo on board the same, have duly performed quarantine in one of the lazarets last mentioned, and upon so producing such documents, the said ship or vessel shall not be obliged to perform quarantine, but shall be forthwith admitted to report, and all goods, wares, and merchandize on board thereof, not hereinbefore enumerated in the first class before stated, shall be admitted to entry; but all goods, wares, and merchandizes on board any such ship or vessel, which are enumerated in the first class before stated, shall in such case perform a further quarantine of fifteen days, at some of the ports or places hereinhefore appointed for that purpose, in such manner as has

been heretofore practised: and whereas information has been received, that the establishment of the lazaret at Trieste is conducted upon the same plan as that of Venice, and that consequently no danger is to be apprehended from admitting ships, vessels, or cargoes arriving from Trieste, having previously performed quarantine at that place, to all the indulgences granted by the before-mentioned Order, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is thereupon pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all ships and vessels arriving in the ports of Great Britain, or the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, having come from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, which with their officers, crews, passengers, and cargoes shall have previously performed quarantine in the lazaret at Trieste, shall be subject only to the rules and regulations prescribed by the forty-third section of His Majesty's Order in Council, of the fifth of April one thousand eight hundred and five, with respect to vessels arriving from Malta, Ancona, Venice, Messina, Leghorn, Genoa, or Marseilles:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Ma-jesty's Secratary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the time being of the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary directions herein

VIIEREAS by an Act passed in the forty-six th year of His Majesty's reign, cap. 98, intituled " An Act for making additional and

"further provisions for the effectual performance ; " of quarantine," it is, amongst other things, enacted; that it shall and may be fawful to and for His Majesty, His heirs and successors, by His or Their Order or Orders in Council, notified by Proclamation or published in the London Gazette, to prohibit all persons, ships, boats, and vessels whatsoever, from going, under any prentence whatsoever, within the limits of any station, which by His Majesty, His heirs, or successors, by His or Their Order or Orders in Council, has been or may be assigned for the performance of quarantine, by any ships or vessels without clean bills of health: and that if any person whatsoever, after such notification or publication of any such Order or Orders in Council, shall presume, under any pretence whatsoever, to go with any ship, boat, or vessel, within the limits of any such station, he or she shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay the sum of five hundred pounds: and whereas His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, was pleased, by His Order in Council of the fifteenth of July one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, to order, and it was thereby ordered, that all merchant ships and ressels, and all other ships and vessels not having the plague, or any other infectious disease or distemper, highly dangerous to the health of His Majesty's subjects, actually on board (except any ship of war, transport, or other ship, in the actual service of Government, under the command of a Commissioned Officer of His Majesty's Navy), coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, and bound to the western ports of the United Kingdom, which should not be furnished with clean bills of health, should perform their quarantine at Milford Haven; subject to such provisions, rules, regulations, and restrictions, pains, penalties, fines, forfeiturers, and punishments, as are contained in His Majesty's Order in Council, bearing date the fifth day of April one thousand eight hundred and five : and whereas the limits of the quarantine station at Milford Haven are now marked off by twelve yellow buoys to point out the same, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and in pursuance of the powers vested in His Majesty by the said Act, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no persons, ships, vessels, or boats whatsoever, other than the vessels or boats belonging to the Superintendant of Quarantine or his assistant, or other boats regularly employed under the authority of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in the quarantine service, shall go, under any pretence whatsover, within the limits of the place so marked out, except in cases of special necessity, and with permission first had and obtained from the Superintendant of Quarantine, at Milford Haven, or his assistant: and it is hereby further ordered, that all ships and vessels, being furnished with clean bills of health, and boats liable to quarantine, which may be ordered to perform the same at Milford Haven, shall come to anchor within the compass of the said yellow buoys, in such place or places as shall be directed by the Superintendant of Quaran-

T is this day ordered by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that the Order in Council of the twentieth of May one thousand eight. hundred and thirteen, permitting vessels trading to the Coast of Africa, to take on board as an assorted part of their cargoes, trading guns, blunderbusses, pistols, and gunpowder, be, and the same is hereby revoked; and it is further ordered, by and with the advice aforesaid, that the Order in Council of the second of January one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, prohibiting the export of arms and ammunition to the places therein specified, be, and the same is hereby also revoked; but whereas it is expedient, that some of the provisions of the said Order in Council of the second of January one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, should be continued; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's service) do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa, or in the West Indies, or on any part of the Continent of America (except to a port or place, or ports or places in His Majesty's territories or possessions on the Continent of North America, or in the territories of the United States of America), of ship or lade any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa, or inthe West Indies, or on the Continent of America (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon pain of induring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to problish the exportation of salt-neith and to tine or his assistant, and shall be kept separate and " prohibit the exportation of salt-petre, and to

enforce the law for empowering His Majesty " to prohibit the exportation of gunpowder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to " empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying e coastwise of salt-petre, gunpowder, or any sort of arms or ammunition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled "An Act to enable His "Majesty to restrain the exportation of naval stores, and more effectually to prevent the exportation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council:"

THEREAS by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, cap. 38, intituled " An Act to empower His Majesty to suspend the ballot or enrolment for the local militia," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by any Order in Council, to direct that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia shall take place; but that such ballot and enrolment shall remain and continue suspended for the period specified in any such Order of Council, and from time to time, by any like Order or Orders in Council, to continue such suspension so long as His Majesty shall deem the same expedient, any thing in any Act or Acts of Parliament to the contrary notwithstanding: and whereas by an Order in Council, made the twenty-seventh of June one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, it was ordered by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia should take place from and after the date of the said Order, for the space of one year, but that the ballot and enrolment for the local militia should remain and continue suspended for the space of one year from the date of the said Order: and whereas it is deemed expedient to continue such suspension of the ballot and enrolment for the local militia for the space of one year from and after the twenty-seventh day of June next; it is therefore ordered by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice the outward voyage to the termination of the home-of His Majesty's Privy Council, that no ballot or envolved the local militia do take place for taken on board at any such port or place not de-the space of one year from and after the twenty- clared liable to infection, shall not be of the

HEREAS the rules and regulations of His Majesty's Order in Council of the fifth of April one thousand eight hundred and five, touching the performance of quarantine; have been under stood to apply to all ships or vessels coming last from ports not declared by the said Order liable to infection, if such ships or vessels had, in the course of their voyage, previously touched at, or taken in a cargo at a port declared liable to infection: and whereas no danger to the public health is to be apprehended from a relaxation of the said rule, in respect to such of the said ships or vessels as shall arrive at any port or place in the United Kingdom, or the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, under the circumstances and according to the provisoes and conditions herein-after expressed and contained, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is therefore pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, direct, and ordain, that ships or vessels which having sailed from ports declared liable to infection, or having taken in a cargo or any goods at any port so declared liable to infection, shall afterwards have proceeded from such port to another port mot declared liable to infection, and shall last sail from any such last mentioned port, and afterwards arrive from thence, either in ballast or with a cargo taken in at such port not declared liable to infection, at any port or place in the United Kingdom, or the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, shall not be liable to the performance of quarantine; provided the Master or Commander, or any other person having the charge of any such ship or vessel, shall declare upon oath, that all goods, wares, or merchandize enumerated in the first or second class of His Majesty's aforesaid Order of the fifth of April one thousand eight hundred and five, which may have been received on board any such ship or vessel at any port de-clared liable to infection, had been landed or otherwise discharged from such ship or vessel at a port not declared liable to infection, at least forty days before the arrival of such ship or vessel at any port of the United Kingdom, or the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man; and that no plague or infectious disease prevailed on board such ship or vessel, either among the crew or passengers, at any time from the commencement of

PROCLAMATION -

FOR PARDONING DESERTERS FROM HIS MAJESTY'S REGULAR LAND FORCES.

War-Office, June 18, 1817.

HEREAS it has been represented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that there are at this time several deserters from the different regular corps in His Majesty's land service, who might be induced to return to their duty by an offer of His Royal Highness's gracious pardon, and that such an instance of His Royal Highness's clemency might have a due influence upon their future behaviour, His Royal Highness has been graciously pleased, in the name and on the behalfof His Majesty, to grant His free pardon to all deserters from His Majesty's regular land forces, who, not having been previously apprehended, shall surrender themselves on or before the 18th day of August next, to the Commanding Officer of any regiment, or to any of the Inspecting Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whose stations are men-

tioned in the margin hereof, or to the Commandant of Albany barracks, in the Leeds. Coventry. Isle of Wight, or to the Commandant of the cavalry barracks at Maidstone, or Liverpool. to any of His Majesty's Justices of the Bristol. Peace in Great Britain. London.

Glasgow. Such deserters, if able-bodied men, and fit for service, shall be sent to the regiments from which they respectively deserted, or be appointed to such regiments in the United Kingdom as His Royal Highness may be pleased to command; and when so placed shall not be liable to be claimed by any other corps to which they may formerly have belonged.

And whereas many of the said deserters may have enlisted into other regular corps, and may now be serving therein, His Royal Highness is graciously pleased to extend to such deserters the benefit of this pardon, and to direct, that they shall continue to serve in the corps wherein they now are, upon declaring themselves to their respective Commanding Officers, on or before the said 18th day of August next, to be deserters; and, after having so declared themselves, they shall not be liable, at any future time, to be claimed by the regiments from which they had formerly deserted.

The Magistrate to whom any deserter from His Majesty's regular forces shall surrender himself, is authorised and required to certify the day on which such deserter surrendered; which certificate is to be delivered to the deserter, to continue in force until the arrival of the deserter at the head-quarters of the nearest military post, provided he proceed at the rate of ten miles a day, unless prevented by sickness; such sickness to be certified by some medical practitioner, on the back of the Magistrate's certificate; or to be otherwise proved, to the satisfaction of the Officer commanding at such military post.

And His Royal Highness having further commanded, that the greatest exertions shall be used, for the future apprehension of all deserters, every soldier now serving ought to be deeply impressed with a sense of the danger to which he will expose himself if he should be guilty of the crime of desertion; and all those who have already committed that offence, ought to feel that they will render themselves liable to the severest punishment if they do not immediately avail themselves of the pardon held out in this His Royal Highness's most gracious Proclamation.

Any soldier who may desert after these His Royal Highness's gracious intentions are made public, shall not be included in the above pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost severity.

ARMY PRIZE-MONEY.

Grant to the Army which served under the Command of Field-Marshal His Grace the Duke of Wellington, in the Battle of Waterloo, and at the Capture of Paris.

Otice is hereby given, pursuant to the Act of the 54th Geo. 3, cap. 86, that the distribution of the proportion of the grant made to the aforesaid army, which appertains to the British troops, will commence and take place, according to the directions and regulations contained in the said grant, at No. 18, Suffolk-Street, Charing-Cross, and Whitehall-Place, as follows:

The general staff and different departments of the army, together with the royal artillery and engineers, between the 25th of June and 24th July 1817.

The corps of cavalry of every description, and those of infantry, from the 1st regiment of foot guards to the 14th regiment of foot, between 25th July and the 24th August 1817.

The remaining corps of infantry, to the 8th line battalion King's German legion, between the 25th August and 24th September 1817.

After which date no further payment can be made by me, as all shares and balances then remaining unclaimed must be paid over to Chelsea Hospital, pursuant to Act of Parliament; But they can afterwards be received from the Deputy Treasurer of that establishment, if claimed within the period of six years.

In order to save the army the expence of powers of attorney and agency, it is thought right to apprise such of the parties concerned, as may not be acquainted therewith, that every officer, non-commissioned officer, and soldier of the British army, entitled to participate in this prize-money, may, if in London, receive the amount due to them, in person, from the distributing agent, on satisfying him that they are the persons entitled to it; or, if at a distance, by drawing on him for the amount, through any banker or other respectable person, according to the following forms and instructions, which must be rigidly attended to.

A communication will this day be made to the officers commanding each corps entitled to participate, instructing him how to obtain the prizemoney due to the non-commissioned officers and privates under his command, without incurring the expence of agency; and, for the information and guidance of such men as have been discharged, and to prevent their being misled by the public notices which have been circulated, "That no person but a licensed agent can draw their prize-money;"

Notice is hereby given, that no person is as yet licensed to acceive army prize-money; and that the security given by navy agents, for their license, cannot be made available for any army prize-money received by them.
