WHEREAS by the forty-third scetion of His Majesty's Order in Council, of the fitth of April one thousand eight hundred and five, it is ordered, that all ships and vessels arriving in the ports of Great Britain, or the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, having come from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, which with their officers, crews, passengers, and cargoes, shall have previously performed quarantiue in the lazaret at Malta, Ancona, Venice, Messioa, Leghorn, Genoa, or Marseilles, shall, upon their arrival, be put uneler quarantine in some of the ports or places hereinbefore appointed for the performance of quarantine, until the Conmauder, Master, or other person having the charge of such ship or vessel shall have produced to the Superintendant of Quarantine, or his Assistant, or to the Principal or other Officer of the Custons authorised to act in that behalf, the proper documents to prove that such ship or vessel, and the officers, crew, passengers, and cargo on board the same, have duly performed quarantine in one of the lazarets last mentioned, and upon so producing such documents, the said ship or vessel shall not be obliged to perform quarantine, but shall be forthwith admitted to report, and ill goods, warcs, and merchandize on buard thereof, not hereinbefore enumerated in the first class before stated, shall be admitted to entry; but all groods, wares, and merchandizes on boart any such ship or vessel, which are cnnmerated in the first class before stated, shall in such case perform a further quarantine of fifteen days, at some of the ports or places herciubefore appointed for that purpose, in such mamer as has
been heretofore practised: and whereas information has been received, that the establishment of the lazaret at Trieste is conducted upon the same plan as that of Venice, and that consequently no danger is to be apprehended from admitting ships, vessels, or cargoes arriving from Trieste, having previously performed quarantine at that place, to all the indulgences granted by the before-mentioned Order, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is thereupon pleased, in the name and on the bebalf of His Majesty, nod by and with the advice of His Majesty's Prity Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all ships and vessels arriving in the ports of Grcat Britain, or the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Allerney, Sark, or Man, having come from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, which with their officers, crews, passengers, and cargoes shall have previonsly performed quarantine in the lazaret at Trieste, shall be subject only to the rules and ragulations prescribed by the forty-third section of His Majesty's Orter in Council, of the fifth of April one thousand eight hundred and five, with respect to vessels arriving from Malta, Ancona, - Fenice, Messina; Leghorn, Genoa, or Marseilles:

And the Right Monourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cingue Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Sccratary at War, and the Govemors or Commanders in Chief for the time being of the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

VFIIEREAS by an Act passed in the fortysisth year of II is Majesty's reign, cap. $9 \dot{8}$, intioned " Aa st for maling additional and
"futher provisions for the effectual performance "s of quarautine," it is, amongst other things, enacted; that it shall and may be fawful to and for His Majesty, His heirs and successors, by His or Their Order or Orders in Council, notified by Proclamation or published in the London Gazette, to prohibit all persons, ships, boats, and vessels whatsoèver, froni griag, under any prentence whatsoever, within the limits of any station, which by His Majesty, His Leeirs, or successors, by His or Their Order or Orders in Council, has been or may be assigned for the performance of quarantine, by any ships or vessels without clean bills of bealh : and that if any person whatsoever, after such notification or publication of any such Order or Orders in Council, stball presume, under any pretence whatsoever, to so with any ship, boat, or vessel, svithin the limits of any such station, he or she shall, for every such offence, foyfeit and pay the sum of five hundred pounds $:$ and whereas His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf- of His Majesty, was pleased, by His Order in Council of the fifteenth of July one thousand eeight hundred and thisteen, to order, and it Whas thereby ordered, that all merchant ships and vessels, and all other'ships and vessels not having the plague, or any other infectious disease or distemper, ihighly dangerous to the health of His Majesty's subjects, actually on board (except any ship of war, transport, or other ship, in the actual service of Government, under the command of a Commissioned Officer of His Majesty's Navy), coming From or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic. Ocean, and bound to the western ports of the Uuited Kingdom, which should not be furnished with clean bills of health, should perform their quarantine at Milford Haven; subject to such provisions, rules, regulations, and restrictions, pains, penalties, fines, forfeiturers, and punishments, as are contained in His Majesty's Order in Council, bearing date the fifth day of April one thousand eight hundred and five: and whereas the limits of the quarantine station at Milford Haven are now marked off by twelve yellow buoys to point out the same, His Royal Highiness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf :of His Majesty, and in pursuance, of the powers vested in His Majesty by the said Act, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no persons, ships, vessels, or boats whatsoever, other than the vessels or boats belonging to the Superintendant of Quarantine or his assistant, or other baats regularly employed under the authority of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in-the quarantine service, shall go, under any pretence whatsover, within the limits of the place so marked out, except in cases of special necessity, and with permission first bad and obtained from the Superintendant of Quarantine, at Milfoxl Haven, or his assiswant: and it is hereby further ordered that all ships and vessels, being furnisbed with clean bills of health, and boats liable to quarantine, which may be ordered to peiform the same at Milford Haven; shall come to anchor within the compass of the said yellow bnoys, in such place or places as shall be directed by the Superintendiat of Quarantine or his assistant, and shall be kept separate and
apart from His Majesty's strips of war;, transports; and vessels in the service of Government, and not having clean bills of mealth, which may be performing quarantine as aforesaid, within the compass of the said yellow breys:
And the Right Honowrable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords: Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

I$T$ is this day ordered by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that the Order in Council of the twentieth of May one thousand eight hundredand thirteen; permitting vessels trading to the Coast of Africh, to take on board as an assorted part of their cargoes, trading guns, blunderbusses, pistols, and gunpowider, be, aiid the same is hereby revoked; and it is turther ordered, by and with the advice aforesaid, that the Order in Gouncil of the second of January one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, prohibiting the export of arms and ammunition to the places therein specified, be, and the same is hereby alo revoked; but whercas it is expedient, that some of the provisions of the said Order in Council of the second of January one thousand eigbt hundred and seventeen, should be contińued; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, "doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordance for His Majesty's service) to, at any time during the space of six months (to conmence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa, or in the West Iudies, or on any part of tlie Continent of America (excent to a port or place, or ports or places in His Majesty's territories or possessións on the Continent of North America, or in the territeries of the Unite States of America), of ship or lade any guppowder or salt-petre, or any sort af arms or ammuntion, on board any ship'or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such parts of places on the Coast of Africa, or in the West Indies, aron the Continent of América (except as above exepted), without leave or permission in that bebalf first obtanded from His Majesty, or His Pisy Council upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inficted by an Act, passed in the twentyminth ycar of His late Majesty's réign, intituled " An Act to eppower His Najesty to "s probibit the exportation of salt-petre, and to

WHEREAS the rules and regulations of Hip Majesty's Order in Council of the fifth of April one thousand eight handred and five, touching the performance of quarantines have been under: stood to apply to all ships or vessels coming lapf from ports not declared by the said Order liable to infection, if such ships or vessels had, in the course of their voyage, previpusly touched at, ot taken in a cargo at a port declared liable to infection: and whereas no danger to the public health is to be apprehended from a relaxation of the said rule, in respect to such of the said ships or vessels is shall arriye at any port or place in the United ${ }^{4}$ Kingdom, or the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Atderney, Sark, or Man, under the circumstances and according to the provisoes and conditions heveitiafter expressed and contained, His Rayal Highness the Prince Regent is therefore pleased, in the name and on the belalf of His Majesty, and by and wif the advice of His Majesty's Priby Council, to orde? direct, and grdain, that ships or vesséls which. having sailed from ports dectared líable to infectiont, or having taken in"a carge ar apy goods at any popt so declared liable to infection, sball afterwards trive proceeded from such port to another prit mpt declared liable to infection, and shall last sail from any such last mentioned port, and afterwards arrive from thence, either in ballast or witli a cargo takey in at such port not declared liable to infection, at any port or place in the United Kingdom, or the istands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, shall not be liable to the performance of quarantine; provided the Master or Commander, or any other person having the charge of any such ship or vessel, shall declare upon oath, that all goods, wares, or merchandize enumerated in the first or second class of His Majesty's aforesaid Order of the fifth of April one thousand eight hundred and 6ye, which may have been received on board any such sbip or vessel at any port declared liable to intection, had been landed or otherwise discharged from such ship or vessel at a port not declared liable to infection, at least forty days before the arrival of such ship or vessel at any port of the United Kingdom, or the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man; and that uo plague or infectious disease prevailed on board such ship or vessel, either among the crew or passengers, at any time from the commetrcement of the outward voyage to the termination of the homeward voyage; and provided also, that the goods taken on board at any such port or place not declared liable to infection, shall not be of the
prowth, produce, or manufacture of any country declared to be llable to infection ; or if any goods of the first class taken into such ship or vessel at such port-or-place not declared liable to infection, shall be of the growth, produce, or manufacture of any country decared liable to infection; then, provided proot shall be given, according to the provisions of the forty-third section of His Majesty's said Order in Council of the fifth of April one thousand cight liundred and five, that such goods have performed quarantine, either, at Malta, Ancolia, Venice, Messina, Leghorn, Genoa, or Marseilles.

TPHIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Deputy Usher of the Black Rod acquainting them, that The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf 'of His Majesty; for declaring His Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable H House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to
An Act for punishing mutiny and desertion, and for the better payment of the army and their quarters.
An Act to authorise the rewarding Qfficers of the Customs for their services in preventing illicit distillation in Scotland, under an Act passed in the last session of Parliament.

An Act to repeal two Acts, passed in the fiftyfourth and ifty-fifth years of His present Majesty, relating to the Office of the Agent-General, and tor transferring the duties of the said Office to the offices of the Paymaster-General and Secretary at War.

An Act to regulate the trade to and from the places within the limits of the charter of the East India Coinpany, and certain possessions of His Majesty in the Mediterranean.
An Act to coutiaue, until the fifteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, an Act of the fifty-second year of His present Majesty, for the more effectual preservation of the peace, by enforcing the duties of watching and warding:

## PROCLAMATION

FOR PARDONING DIRSERTERS FROM HIS MAJESTY'S REGULAR LAND FORCES.

War-Office, Juire 18, 1817 .

WHEREAS it has been representell to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that there are at this time several deserters from the different regular corps in His Majesty's land service, who might be induced to retuin to their duty by an offer of His Royal Highness's gracious, parion, and that such an instance of His Royal Highness's clemency might bave a due influence upon their future behaviour, His Royal Highness bas been graciously pleased, in the name and on the bebalf. of His Majesty; to grant. His free pardon to all deserters froin His Majesty's regular land forces, who, not having been previously apprehended, shall surrender themselves on or before the I8th day of August next, to the Commanding Officer of any regiment, or to any of the Insperting Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whose stations are men-
$\therefore \quad$ tioned in the margin hereof, or to the
Leeds: Commandant of Albany barracks, in the
Coventry. Isle of Wight, or to the Commandant Liverpool. of the eavalry barracks at Maidstone, or Bristol. . to any of His Majesty's Justices of the Londoa. Peace in Great Britain.
Giasgow.: Such deserters, if ablc-bodied men, and fit for service, shall be sent oo the reginients from which they respectively deserted, or be appointed to such regiments in the United Kingdom as His Royal Highness may be pleased to command ; and when so placed shall not be liable to be claimed by any other corps to which they may formerly have belonged.
And whereas many of the said deserters may lraye enlisted into other regular corps, and may now be seiving therein, His Royal Highness is graciously. pleased to extend to such deserters the benefit of
this pardon, and to direct; that they shall centinue to serse in the corps wherein they now.are, upon deciaring themselves to their respective Commanding Officers, on or before the said 18th day of August next, to be deserters ; and, after having so declared themselves, they shall not be liable, at any future time, to be claimed by the regiments from which they bad formerly deserted.

The Magistrate to whom any deserter from His Majésty's regular forces shall surrender hinself, is authorised and required to certify the day ou which such deserter surrendered; which certificate is to be delivered to the deserter, to continue in force until the arrival of the deserter at the head-quarters of the nearest military post, provided he proceed at the rate of ten miles a day, unless prevented by sickness; such sickness to be certified by some medical practitioner, on the back of the Magistrate's certificate; or to be otherwise proved, to the satisfaction of the Officer commanding at such military post.

And His Royal Highness having further commanded, that the greatest exertions shall be used, for the future apprehension of all deserters, every soldier now serving ought to be deeply impressed with a sense of the danger to which he will expose hinself if he should be .guilty of the crime of desertion; and all those who have already conmitted that offence, ought to feel that they will render themselves liable to the severest punishment if they do not immediately a a ail themselves of the pardon held out in this His Royal Highness's most gracious Proclamation.

Any soldier who may desert after these His Royal Highaess's gracious intentions are made public, shall not be included in the above pardon, but be proceeded agaiust with the utmost severity.
