## A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, P. R.

**W**HEREAS it hath been represented unto Us, that divers misguided persons, in some of the midland counties of England, have of late years committed various acts of outrage, in breaking and destroying frames used in making stockings, lace, and other articles in the frame-worked-knitted manufactory, and that, among other instances of such outrages, a most heinous one was committed on the night of the twenty-eighth day of June one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, at Loughborough, when a large number of such frames was broken, and an attempt was made to murder one of the persons entrusted with the care of them; and whereas it hath been further represented unto Us, that such outrages have for the most part been prompted by a desire, on the part of the journeymen employed in the said manufactory, to dictate to their masters the terms on which the manufactory should be carried on, or the prices at which work should be done, which dictation is utterly inconsistent with the principles of justice, and destructive of the freedom and prosperity of trade; and whereas measures have been taken by the wisdom of His Majesty's Parliament for repressing such outrages in future, by increasing the punishment for the same; and in the hope that such measures will effectually deter persons from the future commission of such offences, We are desirous of extending His Majesty's most gracious pardon to all those who have hitherto offended herein, except as hereinafter is mentioned: We have therefore thought fit, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to issue this Proclamation, and in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, We do hereby promise and declare, that every person who hath committed any offence against the form of the Statute made in the fifty-fourth year of

His Majesty's reign, for the punishment of persons destroying stocking or lace frames, but hath not yet been charged therewith, and who shall, previous to the first day of September next ensuing, appear before some Justice of the Peace or Magistrate, and declare such his offence, and when, where, and by whom the same was committed, shall receive His Majesty's most gracious pardon for such offence, and that no confession so made by any such person shall be given in evidence in any Court or in any case whatever; provided nevertheless that nothing herein contained shall extend to the offence so committed at Loughborough as aforesaid, nor to any other offence, except such as may have been committed contrary to the said Statute made in the fifty-fourth year aforesaid.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, the fifteenth day of July one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, in the fifty-seventh year of His Majesty's reign.

**W**HEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-third year of His Majesty's reign, cap. 155, it is enacted, that it shall not be lawful for any private person or persons to import any goods, wares, or merchandise, from any port or place within the limits of the East India Company's charter, except only into such ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland as shall be provided with warehouses, together with wet docks or basins, or such other securities as shall, in the judgment of the Lord High Treasurer, or of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, for the time being, or any three or more of them, in Great Bri-

tain and Ireland respectively, be fit and proper for the deposit and safe custody of all such goods, wares, and merchandise, as well as for the collection of all duties payable thereon, and shall have been duly declared so to be, by the Order of His Majesty in Council, in Great Britain, or by the Order of the Lord Lieutenant in Council, in Ireland: And whereas the port of Bristol has been deemed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in Great Britain to be fit and proper for the deposit and safe custody of all such goods, wares, and merchandise, as well as for the collection of all duties payable thereon; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, is thereupon pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the port of Bristol is a port fit and proper for the deposit and safe custody of all such goods, wares, and merchandise, as well as for the collection of all duties payable thereon.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, cap. 57, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty, to suspend training, and to regulate the quotas of the militia," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by any Order or Orders in Council, to suspend the calling out of the militia of the United Kingdom, or any part of the United Kingdom, or of any county, riding, shire, stewartry, city, town, or place, for the purpose of being trained and exercised in any year, and to order and direct that no training or exercising of the militia of the United Kingdom, or of any county or counties, riding or ridings, shire or shires, stewartry or stewartries, city or cities, town or towns, or place or places, specified in any such Order or Orders in Council, shall

take place in any year, any thing contained in any Act or Acts of Parliament relating to the militia, to the contrary notwithstanding: And whereas it is deemed expedient that such training and exercising should be dispensed with in the present year; it is ordered by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that the calling out of the militia of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain, for the purpose of being trained and exercised in the present year, be suspended, and that no training or exercising of the said militia do take place in the present year.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to appoint the Right Honourable John Lord Sommers to be Lord Lieutenant of the county of Hereford, in the room of the Earl of Essex, resigned.

*Whitehall, August 25, 1817.*

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, taking into His royal consideration the eminent services performed by Rear-Admiral Sir David Milne, Knight-Commander of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, upon various occasions during a period of thirty seven years in His Majesty's service, particularly his signal intrepidity when Second Lieutenant of His Majesty's ship *Blanche*, on the 5th day of January 1795, in action with the French national frigate *La Pique*, of superior force, which after a sanguinary engagement was compelled to surrender to the *Blanche*; as also his judicious and persevering conduct in the subsequent command of the said frigate *La Pique*, in the capture of the French ship *La Seine*, on the 30th June 1798; and his conspicuous gallantry on the 20th August 1800, when being Captain of the last mentioned ship, he, after an arduous action, succeeded in capturing the French frigate *Vengeance*, although greatly superior to the ship under his command in size, guns, and number of men; and His Royal Highness, being desirous in an especial manner to evince the sense he entertains of the distinguished merits of the said Rear-Admiral in the above brilliant actions, and more particularly his meritorious conduct as second in command, at the attack upon the town and shipping of Algiers, on the 27th day of August last, upon which occasion he commanded His Majesty's ship *Impregnable*, and by his signal intrepidity and skill eminently contributed to the glorious and successful result of that memorable day, hath been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to grant unto the said Sir David Milne His Majesty's royal licence and permission that he and his descendants may, as a lasting memorial of His Majesty's royal approbation, bear the armorial distinctions following, viz. "A cross moline quarterly,

"pierced between three mullets, on a chief of honourable augmentation wavy, a fortified light-house, thereon a red flag flying, flanked by a battery of three tiers of guns, with a like flag on the dexter, and another battery on the sinister," the whole being intended to represent that part of the works defending the town and port of Algiers, to which His Majesty's ship Impregnable, bearing the flag of the said Rear-Admiral, was opposed on the said ever-memorable attack: and for crest, "Out of a naval crown a cubit arm, holding the flag of a Rear-Admiral of the Blue, inscribed with the word IMPREGNABLE:" provided the said honourable armorial distinctions be first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's-College, otherwise His Majesty's said licence and especial mark of His Royal favour to be void and of none effect.
