T is this day ordered by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that the Order in Council of the twentieth of May one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, permitting vessels trading to the Coast of Africa; to take on board as an assorted part of their cargoes, trading guns, blunderbusses, pistols, and gunpowder, be, and the same is hereby revoked; and it is further ordered, by and with the advice aforesaid, that the Order in Council of the second of January one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, prohibiting the export of arms and ammunition to the places therein specified, be, and the same is hereby also revoked; but whereas it is expedient, that some of the provisions of the said Order in Council of the second of January one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, should be

by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's service) do, at any time during the space of six months (to com-mence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa, or in the West Indies, or on any part of the Continent of America (except to a port or place, or ports or places in His Majesty's territories or possessions on the Continent of North America, or in the territories of the United States of America), or ship or lade any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa, or in the West Indies, or on the Continent of America (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to empower His Majesty to " prohibit the exportation of salt-petre, and to " enforce the law for empowering His Majesty " to prohibit the exportation of gunpowder, or " any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to any sort of arms or annumentation, and also to "empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying "coastwise of salt-petre, gunpowder, or any sort of arms or ammunition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His Majesty's reign, cap. 2, initialed "An Act to enable His "empower of the superfactor of payal . Majesty to restrain the exportation of naval stores, and more effectually to prevent the ex-" portation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, " when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council :"
