"That, by order of the Russian Government, the Light-House erected in the year 1815, on Cape Lativanem, was, for the greater benefit of the navigation between Narva and Revel, to be removed to the Island of Rodscher, situated at the distance of nine nautical miles to the westward of the Isle of Hogland; the light to be at the height of sixty feet above the surface of the water, and, in imitation of the light at Lativanem, to appear and disappear, successively, in the space of $\frac{1}{4}$ of a minute, which operation will make it distinguishable from all the other lights in the environs of Hogland. The new light at Rodscher to be exhibited from the 1st September 1817 (old style)."
