Here is lately arrived at Caflichaven, The Sub miffion of Briffol, chaced in thicker by to Privateer of 40 Guns, thee came feven weeks fince, from Barbadees, from whence the was licenfed by the Governor the Lord Willoughby: y a person finst Company arrived here, we are affured of the requestion of Moniferras, which being forlaken by the French, and left in the hands of fome Irifh, they had the e made themselves a Governor, till fome few of our Fregats with fothe Merchantmenappearing before i , with French Colours, our Men got in opportunity of landing without opposition, and then advicing their Ensignes, the English that were before driven into the Woods came in likewile upon the Irifb, and made them all Priloners, fending them away for Acavis : Antego is likewife well fortified by the English, and the reft of the Panerions in a good pofture.

We have also received a confirmation of the News, that the Biglif Fleet has bernt leveral of the French thips at the Lecand Iflands ; we are also affured that the Colcheffer hath rewho the Coventry, with leveral French Gentlemen about her, in their return homewards, and that the Barbados-Brechatte was fafely arrived at Earbador with 300 Blacks.

Our A vices from Poland cell us , that the Sieur Morfrein, in this return from Warfam, was met by leveral Palifh Gentlemen, who being diffatisfied with his N goriation, forced him to deliver to them all his Letters, and to give them on account of what has passed upon the French account in prejudice to the Republiques and after fome levere uisge, enquired of him what may the French would take in their march for Poland, whom eley mere refolved to oppole ; its alfo faid, that they afterwards obliged him to follow them to Pofen. The N bilky in cheir late Affembly, meeting to a very great number in the Field, have made a folemn leagu, inder an oath, to defend their Antient priviledges with their lives and foreunes , intending to prels the King to dilmils a'l farreign Ministera from the Court; efpetially the French, of whose defigns they are infinitely jealous.

Milan, Tune 24. By our late letters from Madrid we are told, that our Governor Don Louis Pous de Leon, is ebblen G vernor to the young King of Spain, who 'the believed will be fuddenly called hence to enter upon that Honourable Employment, and a Succeffor be fent in his room.

Cologne, July 3. The Princes of Furthenberg, with the Bimops of Stratsbourg, are here expeding Courriers from the Electors of Mayence and Treves. From Liege; they tell us, that Monfigur de Crequy is advanced fare into that Country, and that the Country Prople are for fear of his Army fled into Liege with the best of their Goods. The Bishop of Munfter continues his Leavier, and notwithsanded he will follow the French Intereft.

The Elact of Mayence is at present at Aschaffenburg but Intends in little time to go from thence to Lahaffeis npon the Rhine, where the Electors of Treves and Cologne, with the P inces of Furftenberg in end a Conference.

Venice, July 8. The fiege is carried on a Candia, by the Grand Vifier, with all Industry imaginable ; their Batteries faid, they have given a lufty affault to the Town, but have been beaten off with very great lofs. The Senate are not wanting in their liberal contribution of supplies of all necessions. The Convoy under the command of Signice Gistons Celfe (se supple) are by this arrived, with four other Gillies t vas Rail for them at Corfu, and went in company thence for Zante, where they expected to joyn with the Auxiliary Gellies from Maltha, Rome, Florence, and other parts of Italy: Only the Spanish Gellies are recalled, and to be employed in defence of their own Countries against the French. Our Armata lies at as near a diftence as poffib'y they are able to Canca, the Sanadrons in their turns continually cruling to hin fer the supplies intended to them. S ven of their gallies defigned for Canea, were by our thips forced to put in at Chifano, where for fome time they were confined by fome Man of War of the Armata, that lay before the Harbor, but a Temp it unhappily rifing, forced them off, and gave liberty corhe Tu kish Gallies to put again to Ses, and to pass into Candia, where they are fill kept in by our Pleet: The liberty given by our Admiral to Privateers, to take the benefit of all pizes to themielves has brought in about 14 flout Velle sto the Fieet, who by their continual plying upon the Seas, do great damage to the Turks, and have particularly taken three Saicks, besiles other Vessels coming out of Candia.

Hambourg, July 9. The Princels Landtgrave of Hels has been honousable received and entertained at Bremen in her way homewards, as the was at Standt and Bremerverde. This day 'tis fail the City of Bremen is to do homage to the Swedes, according to agreement.

By an Express from Musco we are affured, that on the 16th. of May laft, there happened a great Fire at Archangel; which beginning in the Butchery, where no inhabitants were ; beginning it fpread with fuch violence, that having in a little space of time confumed three back Streets; it feited upon the est Trade yards and Warehouses of the English, Durch and Ruffien Merchants, with the Hall and Cofforne-houles and the gr ateft part of the b.ft buildings in the Town.
